MATTERS ARISING

SHIRLEY LODGE ESTATE & FEN ROAD TRAFFIC

2011 - ESTATE FENCING (1989) Reply had been received from Messrs Moss saying that they had arranged for the planting of hawthorn shrubs to be completed this month.

2012 (a) - ESTATE DEVELOPMENT (C/70/412) (1926) Messrs Moss had also replied expressing their disappointment at the Parish Council's determination not to reverse their original decision (i.e. for two access roads - see 1726) and saying they had no alternative but to appeal in due course.

2012 (b) - ESTATE TRAFFIC A letter from the County Surveyor (ref: DD.SG/P.87, 13 Sept. 1972) stated that:

- (i) the estimated capacity of the Fen rd. had not yet been reached although increasing
- (ii) it would be difficult to justify at a public inquiry any objection to the whole of the Shirley Lodge Estate traffic being channeled through Fen rd
- (iii) at the same time he could see no objection to the County Planning Officer's current proposals* that the Shirley Lodge Estate Traffic should be channeled equally through Fen rd and Old School Lane

* Clerk's note: These proposals (for two accesses) originated from the Parish Council - see 1691 & 1714 - and were accepted by the County Planning Officer and County Surveyor.

- (iv) He (the Surveyor) understood the County Planning Officer is aware of the Parish Council's concern and does not propose to recommend any alteration of the previously approved layout but he could not commit the County Planning Officer in relation to the consideration of the development of the second half of the Estate.

2013 FEN RD./GODING WAY JUNCTION (1928) The County Surveyor replied on 13th. Sept. (DD.SG/P.87) to the Council's request for a mirror at this junction regretting that existing legislation does not allow this; he said that there were various reasons against mirrors.

2014 - PARISH COUNCIL INSURANCES (1993) The Council considered a schedule of proposed insurances drawn up by the Clerk and valuations were agreed under 5 sections of the National Association of Parish Councils' Amalgamated Insurance offered by the Cornhill Insurance Co. The Clerk was instructed to implement these policies as soon as possible.

2015 - COUNCIL HOUSES LAY-BY (1994) The County Surveyor had replied that he would forward the Parish Council's request to the Dept. of the Environment suggesting inclusion in the 1973/74 trunk road improvement plans.

2016 - STATE OF FOOTPATH - CAMBRIDGE ROAD (1994) The County Surveyor had replied that the length of footway complained of i.e. -

(2016 - contd.) in front of 25 to 27 Cambridge rd. - would be inspected and repaired as necessary.

2017 - LAND AT BUTT The County Surveyer had replied that this land LANE CORNER (2004) was to be tidied (it had, in fact, now been done) and would write again on hearing from the Dept. of the Environment as to its future.

2018 - 'BUS SERVICE TO Mrs. Kearney had written to ask (with the IMPINGTON COLLEGE support of many parents) if the Council would approach the 'bus Company about a service to and from Impington College.

Mr. Easy proposed and Mr. Nurse seconded that independent Companies be approached and the parents asked to form themselves into an organisation which would guarantee the fares to the Company if one were found willing to provide a service.

2019 - THE 1973 ANNUAL This was agreed for TUESDAY, 20th. March PARISH MEETING 1973; the School Headmaster, Mr. Whitten, to be informed to avoid the unfortunate clash of meetings which occurred this year.

2020 - PLANNING APPLICATION CONSIDERED

D.S. Clarke Esq., Fen rd. Chesterton - erection of a dwelling in connection with livestock and calf-rearing units.

The Clerk was instructed to reply that the Parish Council could not approve this on the grounds that the County Council inform them that the Chesterton Fen rd. environment is 'not good enough' for a gypsy caravan site so it would obviously not be good enough for a dwelling.

2021 - BILLS FOR Proposed by Mr. Nurse, seconded by Mr. Wenham and PAYMENT agreed that the following be paid:
