I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

1. 352/88 Minutes of the meeting of 5th September had been circulated. Minute 321/88 was amended. The minutes were then confirmed and signed. An amendment to minute 351/88 was made. The minutes of the Special Meeting of 15 September were also confirmed and signed.

2. Matters Arising

353/88 <u>Country Park</u>. The Public Inquiry was due to start on (204/88) October 6th.

- 354/88 Play Areas. Bovis had submitted through S.C.D.C. proposals (215/88) for equipping the toddlers play area on their phase 2. Council welcomed the proposal adding that the depth of bark mulch should be 18 inches and that fencing needed to be provided to keep out rubbish and dogs.

 A landscaping scheme proposed for the Twigden play area would make it difficult for the play equipment requested by M.P.C. to be erected. The clerk would contact Mr. Hellingsworth, Trees Officer to explain the situation.
- 355/88 Care for the Elderly. D.A.R. had prepared a fact sheet (219/88) detailing the services available in Milton for senior citizens. A copy was given to each councillor. D.A.R. felt that a copy could be inserted in the Village Voice to be decided at November meeting.

 Thanks were due to Susan Chapman and Pat Fletcher for their advice.
- 356/88 <u>Ditch. Coles Road.</u> S.C.D.C. were hoping to begin necessary (259/88) maintenance works immediately.
- 357/88 Open Space. As there appeared to have been no progress made (315/88) it was agreed to request a written statement from Mr. Evens, solicitor of the position. The matter to be discussed at a meeting to be held after the Public Meeting of October 10th.
- 358/88 Methane Gas Testing. The clerk would inquire from (317/88) Mr. Walton of the County Council about future monitoring of Middleton's Pit.
- 359/88 Proposed Cycleway. The clerk would write to the (319/88) Transportation Department welcoming the proposed cycleway and asking that the plan be expedited.
- 360/88 Dogs. The C.A.L.C. agreed that fencing seemed to be the (321/88) only answer to keep dogs out of play areas.

361/88 Sheltered Housing. It was agreed to put "Sheltered (324/88) Housing for the Elderly" on the agenda of November 7th.

362/88 Dispensing in Milton. Mr. Moore and Mr. Salter of the (351/88)F.P.C. would attend the public meeting of October 10th. Dr. Draper was not allowed to attend. E.M.C.D. and J.E.C. both felt that a representative to speak on behalf of Dr. Draper should attend. D.B.W. proposed and J.F.C.F. seconded that the following resolution be put to the public meeting:-

"Having examined the position as far as is able M.P.C. recommends that a medical practice with dispensing facility should be maintained in this village."

There were 7 votes in favour and 2 abstentions.

Council would meet after the Public Meeting to discuss the response to be made to the F.P.C.

3. 363/88 R.H.A. Document - Time for a Change. The Health Authority document "Time for a Change," had been circulated.

J.F.C.F. proposed that Council support option 5A since this option would provide a comprehensive cover of all

services at Addenbrookes Hospital.

There were 8 votes in favour and one abstention.

- 4. 364/88 <u>Joint Meeting with Milton Community Centre</u>. The Joint Meeting was set for October 24th. The agenda was circulated.
- 5. 365/88 Shopping Trips. Suzannah Jones who had kindly provided the minibus for shopping trips for senior citizens was now unable to do so. The clerk would thank her and Mrs. Summerfield for their help during the past two years.

 The clerk hoped to provide a minibus service if the insurance could be arranged.

 J.F.C.F. proposed and all agreed to authorise expenditure of up to £60 on at least two trips before Christmas.

 A review to be held in January.
- 6. 366/88 Christmas Arrangements. It was agreed to arrange carol singing around the tree for Tuesday December 20th.

 The clerk would make the necessary arrangements.
