1 906	MINUTES OF MEETING OF NOVEMBER 2nd. 1971
	The Clerk read these out and duplicated copies were circulated to members. They were confirmed and signed.
	MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES.
1907	Rec. Grd. Fence (Gravel pit bdy) (1893) - The Clerk understood from the R.D.C. Engineer that this had now been repaired with extra strong materials.
	The Clerk was instructed to thank him accordingly.
1908	Winship Estate. Screen of Trees (1894) - Members reported that trees had now been planted along the residents' boundary and entrance road.
1909	Cambridge road entrance to Rec. Grd. (1895) - The Clerk had had further complaint from the resident next to the entrance of continued misuse of the roadway.
	The Engineer had assured the Clerk that a gate was to be erected shortly; he had also agreed to leave the thorn tree near which he planned to arrange foot access.
1910	Northern By-Pass (1897) - Notification had arrived that morning of the public inquiry to commence on February 15th. in Cambridge. On proposition of Mr. Forbes, seconded by Mr. Wenham the Council agreed to send Mr. Kiddle and the Clerk as representatives to present the objection.
1911	<u>Public toilets and allied facilities (1898)</u> - The Clerk agreed to consult the Engineer and arrange to discuss plans with him.
1912	Waste Land. Coles road (1900) - The Clerk read a letter from Messrs Cooper Bros. in which they had now reduced their request for development to one house and also asked for an offer for a certain piece of the remaining land.
	In view of their letter of April, 1970, offering some of the land as agift to the Council, the Clerk was instructed to seek clarification.
1913	Countryside Planning (1901) - The Council approved the village survey submitted by the Committee formed for that purpose (Messrsaterese, nMessrs Nurse, Summerfield and the Clerk) which had been circulated to all Council members, and the Council's thanks to the Committee were unanimously expressed.
1914	Milton Pits (1902) - The Clerk submitted a detailed natural history survey of Milton Pits carried out by Mr.Graham Easy, a local naturalist, which had been forwarded on Mr. Easy's behalf by the Cambridge Naturalists Trust to the County Council.

The Parish Council commended this work and and the Clerk was instructed to pass this comment on to Mr. Easy and the County Planning Dept in connection with the village survey (Min. 1909, preceding).

1915

PROPOSED INCREASE IN SPEED LIMIT THROUGH MILTON

The Council had been notified of this proposal by the Highways Dept. who asked for the Council's comments for submission to the Dept. of Environment.

The Clerk had circulated a Report on the A.10 using traffic statistics given him by the Highways Dept. The meeting discussed the traffic dangers in the village and the proposals at some length.

It was finally agreed not to oppose the raising of the limit as it appeared that 40 m.p.h. now had to be accepted as a gen eral and more realistic speed. The Clerk was instructed to temper this comment, however, with the firm request that supporting safety measures should accompany any change in speed limit, as follows:

- 1. To repeat this Council's request for re-positioning of the limit signs at each end of the village to give more warning of built-up area and particularly to include the three factory entrances in the built-up area
- 2. Temsuggest that an even better improvement would be to restrict the length of road between King's Hedges and the village, thus making restriction continuous from Cambridge and right through Milton.
- 3. Ask for pedestrian refuges at the open Fen road junction, where elderly people, particularly, find difficulty in crossing the A.10 safely.

FETITION FOR IMPROVEMENT TO SCHOOL CROSSING

A petition signed by 68 persons and forwarded by Mr.&Mrs Hansen, of 5, Pryors Close, Milton, had been received fellowing ewing an incident in which their son was slightly injured on the crossing.

The petitioners suggested, either a kerb barrier, a footbridge or traffic lights operated when children were crossing. The petition was fully discussed.

Agreed that the sfaety precautions in Milton were greater than most other places as the amber warning lights were one of the only four sets as yet in the County. It was thought that the flashing amber lights may be better seen if brighter and set on brackets to overhang the middle of the payment.

The Clerk was instructed to send copies of the petition to the Chief Constable and the Clerk of the County Council and add the above criticisms. He was also instructed to reply to the petitioners regretting that their suggestions were out of this Council's control but it would be forwarded

It was unanimously agreed that a letter of appreciation be sent to Mr. Ray, the crossing warden, expressing the Councilds confidence in the way in which he carried out his difficult task.

1916

The Clerk reported that estimated expenditure for next year would be about then same as last year with the one exception that allowance should be made for possible expenditure on toilets and allied facilities, in which case an increase in the parish rate seemed inevitable.

Proposed by Mr. Forbes, seconded by Mr. Summerfield and agreed unanimously, to precept for the sum of £1250; this is equivalent to 1.7p rate.

REVISION OF LOCAL 'BUS SERVICES 1919

> A schedule of proposed changes to operate from early in the new year had been received.

On the 109 Service the bus company planned to operate an approximately hourly service through Milton, and half hourly, most of Saturday. The 21.20 from Cambridge to Milton was to be withdrawn as the loading averages no more than two.
