- 2600 S/1302/74/F E.J.Nicholas: Park of 15 Caravans off O.S.Lane: Refused:  
( Green belt & prejudicial to recreational use of area; sewage embargo.
- 2601 S/1290/74/O E.J.Nicholas: Horse-riding school & dwelling: premature to  
( full appraisal of future Country Park & cd. be rpejudicial; embargo.
- 2602 S/1019/74/O L.W.Sandford: New Scout HQ, rear of Coles rd. Refused:  
insufficient information
- 2603 Parish consultation A consultation form for parishes which may be affected  
by, or interest in, development in neighbouring parish, has been intro-

whether this house was being converted into flats. (if so, both change  
of use and embargo would be involved.)

MATTERS ARISING

- 2605 CHANGING ROOMS( ) PK (Chmn. of the Working Party) reported completion of the  
building to damp course level and next stage to be comm-  
enced. The Clerk was asked to write to Mr.J.Taylor, the  
Architect, expressing concern at the likely end-costs of professional fees.

LMF agreed to check with Mr. Martindale whether the Council's public lia-  
bility policy covered injury to the public (eg children) on the building  
site during construction.

- 2606 MILTON VILL- AGE PLAN( ) Following the suggestion of the Village Plan Team members  
agreed to help in the distribution of leaflets at the  
required time.

- 2607 MILTON BY- PASS. (2579) Parish Allotments The position under the issued CPO's was  
discussed. The Clerk expressed grave fears as to possible  
loss of Allotment land to the parish and also failure of  
the Co. Land Agent to reply to his inquiries.

- 2608 NEW BYE- LAW The Clerk reported receipt of a Straw & Stubble burning Bye-  
Law Law to operate from March 1, 1975.

- 2609 AGRICULTURAL MACHIN- ERY SITE ( ) Mrs Jones observed that traffic congestion & the  
roadside parking stretching into Milton at the  
monthly Monday sale was now worse than ever. The  
Clerk reminded members that representations had been made to the City.

- 2610 HIGHWAYS Mrs Jones also asked that represatations be made regarding the  
bad state of pavements in Goding Way & Wilson Way.

- 2611 COUNCILLOR Mr. Nurse said he would shortly be leaving the village and  
MJD NURSE with regret would have to offer his resignation soon from  
the Council. This was received with equal regret & Mr. Forbes,  
from the Chair, expressed the appreciation of the Council for all the helpful  
work Mr. Nurse had done for the village for a number of years.

2612 FUTURE COUN- It now having been agreed to change the regular meeting  
CIL MEETINGS night to Mondays (MIN: ) & the Village Hall not  
being available, the Clerk was asked to find another  
meeting place.
