I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

1. 271/94 Library. Mike Hosking and Lynda Martin of the Library Service attended.
At the worst the cost of provision of a library at Milton would be about £340,000. The County Council would have to meet the annual costs. A summary of the use of libraries by Milton residents indicated the need for a library in the village.
Requests for libraries would be discussed by the County Council in October/November.
D.T.W. thanked Mike Hosking and Lynda Martin for attending. It was agreed that the clerk write reiterating that M.P.C. had campaigned over many years and were still campaigning for a library in Milton. To be discussed in September.
2. 272/94 Minutes of the meeting of June 6th 1994 having been circulated were confirmed and signed.
3. Matters Arising
 - 273/94 (189/94) Traffic Calming. Copy of the Village Speed Control Working Group (VISP) Final Report Summary was circulated. Agreed to discuss at later meeting.
 - 274/94 (190/94) South Cambs Police Consultation Group. Next meeting set for 5th July.
 - 275/94 (237/94) Local Government Review. Briefing Paper No. 10 received. I.F.M. reported on a meeting held at I.V.C. with Social Services.
Views of councillors remained unaltered.
 - 276/94 (239/94) Waterbeach Barracks. Noted that Noisy Training was due to take place during July.
 - 277/94 (244/94) Community Care. I.F.M. reported that the warden and Day Centre schemes were working well.
 - 278/94 (248/94) (see also 245/94) Sheltered Housing. An up to date architect's plans of a possible sheltered housing scheme in the grounds of Milton Hall was circulated by R.T.S.
R.R. put forward his own ideas for a scheme using Walkling Way, Recreation Close and part of the Recreation Ground.
It was agreed to invite K. Crandall, S.C.D.C. to a meeting to discuss the provision of sheltered housing in Milton.
 - 279/94 (249/94) Bus Shelters. Noted that Eastern Electricity had agreed in writing to reconnect electricity supply free of charge. Agreed to ask organisations in village not to put posters up in new shelters.

(250/94) Pedestrian Crossing. This was being dealt with by D. Brace of the County Council.

(251/94) Boundary Sign. It was felt that the Milton/Impington sign should be kept (perhaps in a museum?) and that a replacement be cast to be erected on site. The clerk to make inquiries. (Reason for not replacing original sign - sign is made of cast iron and likely to be stolen.)

(253/94) Cambridge News Covenant. Noted that Council expected to receive some sort of compensation in return for waiving the covenant.

The architect would draw up plans and meet with the sub committee. Agreed that R.T.S. become a member of this committee.
D.T.W. had as yet been unable to contact the District Valuer.
There were concerns about the cost of the replacement car park.
The clerk to make inquiries about the cost of a replacement car park and also to take advice from the District Auditor. It was confirmed by Taylor Vinters that Tomkins Mead and land adjacent to 83 Coles Road was registered in the name of Milton P.C.

(253/94) M.C.C. Constitution. Mr. Womack of Taylor Vinters was concerned about size of M.C.C. committee. The clerk to give reasons for committee size and to ask Mr. Womack to ensure that through the Charity Commissioners the M.C.C. executive committee operates legally under the constitution.
