2222 - CIRCULATED MINUTES OF MEETING OF JULY 24, last were confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

2223 - PROPOSED COUNTRY PARK (2180) The Clerk referred to his Report of a meeting at the Shire Hall circulated to members before this meeting (see copy filed in MINUTES)

The Council accepted the Report and further developments are awaited

2224 - NEXT YEARS A.P.M. (2195) The Clerk reported that the Village Hall Manager, Mrs.D.Jones, had confirmed the Hall would be available for the public Annual Parish Meeting, on WEDNESDAY, 10, APRIL, 1974.

2225 - WASTE LAND COLES ROAD (2203) The Clerk reported receipt of the Transfer deed from the Council's solicitors and briefly summarised the contents. It was agreed further scrutiny was desirable by members and was to be returned to the Clerk with the two necessary signatures.

2226 - STATE OF THE HALINGWAY (2204) Mr.Easy reported this repair still outstanding

2227 - LITTER (2205) Mr.D.Watson, Scout Leader, had replied that he would be very pleased to organise a litter collection in co-operation with the Guides and would contact Mrs. Kearney

The Council expressed their appreciation of his keen interest.

2228 - FOULING BY DOGS (2207) (i) It was agreed to correct the wording for the notices to "Please keep your dogs from fouling the sports and children's play areas"

(ii) Bye-law no. 10 The Clerk had received from the Clerk of the County Council, a copy of a notice drawing attention to County Council Bye-law no.10 which applies throughout the County, except in the City of Cambridge and the Borough of Wisbech.

It provides that "no person being in charge of a dog shall allow the dog to foul the footway of any street or public place by depositing its excrement thereon..." It carries a penalty of £20.

2229 - PUBLIC TOILETS & CHANGING ROOMS (2209) The Clerk reported on a letter from the Secretary of the Management Committee. The Committee, at an Extraordinary Meeting had received the changing room proposals with "unanimous approval". They suggested a revised layout to provide a larger "reception area" which would also serve as a Committee meeting place, and also suggested that representatives of the Football and Cricket Clubs might meet the architect and discuss the proposals in greater detail.

They hoped to be in a position to contribute £333 p.a. to make £1,000 over 3 years and the two clubs had agreed to set up a fund also to raise £1,000 over 3 years.

The Committee also suggested that an extension to the changing rooms be included to provide a garage to house the Land Rover and gang mowers (at present in a temporary shed).

2230 - MILK BOTTLE RECOVERY SERVICE (2210) The Clerk reported that, at his request, the Public Health Inspector had investigated the premises and sought the co-operation of the Management in removing the dangers of broken glass in their bunker, and also to prevent access through the hedge from the Recreation Ground.

2231 - VILLAGE HALL INSURANCES (2211 ii) After discussion, the Council agreed that re-valuation of the Village Hall was urgent and that the Clerk write to the Committee suggesting this be undertaken forthwith.
