I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

- 1. 318/93 Doctors Steward and Hunt attended to outline the problems facing the doctors' practice. The premises at 81 Cambridge Road were leased to the practice on a temporary basis (3 years) and the doctors needed to find new premises in order to expand, through renting, buying or having a new surgery built if land were available. A purpose built surgery would take 2½ years to complete. The doctors were hoping for private financial support.

 D.T.W. thanked the doctors for attending and outlining their plans.
- 2. 319/93 Minutes of the meeting of 6 September 1993 having been circulated were confirmed and signed.

3. <u>Matters Arisinq</u>

J.E.C. proposed and H.M.S. seconded that Council buy more sockets for "Drive Carefully" signs to be installed in Coles Road. Three votes in favour three against. The chairman used his casting vote against. The clerk to ask the County Council for a school sign in Humphries Way.

R.T.S. proposed R.J.F. seconded and all agreed that a letter be sent to M.C.C. concerning the surface under the "honeycomb whirl" at The Sycamores recreation ground.

321/93 <u>Chesterton Fen.</u> Meeting between J.E.C., H.M.S. and (229/93) National Rivers Authority arranged for October 20th.

322/93 <u>Bulb Planting</u>. J.E.C. had not been able to purchase the bulbs. Agreed to leave for 1993.

323/93 Mobile Warden Scheme. As the original sub committee (262/93) (see min 69/93) had already met D. Kelleway it was agreed that J.F.C.F. arrange a meeting between this committee and the M.P.C. sub committee. M.P.C. sub committee to gather information and make recommendations to Council.

324/93 <u>Local Government Review</u>. The clerk to ask County Council (263/93) for copies of the various options being discussed.

325/93 <u>Police Consultation Group</u>. The next meeting was set (265/93) for 12 October. I.F.M. hoped to attend.

	330/93 (276/93)	Community Policeman. Agreed to write to Inspector Hayes expressing concern at the level of policing.

	332/93 (279/93),	Country Park. Agreed to ask County Council to move the sign from the Ely Road (which directed traffic through the village) to the A45/A10 interchange. The clerk to ask S.C.D.C. to allow M.P.C. two representatives on the management committee. "Dog Bye Laws" to be discussed at November meeting.

	335/93 (284/93)	Bus Stop. R.T.S. proposed J.E.C. seconded and all agreed that Council buy 3 bus shelters from Queensbury for installation at High Street near chapel and either side of the road near Tesco. A quote for installing a lay by at Humphries Way/ Landbeach Road was received from the County Council. Agreed to ask County Council and City Services for quotations to include costs for public service utilities
	336/93 (296/93)	Parish Council Centenary Gala. Agreed to discuss at November meeting.
)	33 7 /93 (298/93)	<u>Landfill Site.</u> Noted that East Waste Ltd were monitoring the situation.
	4. 338/93 (266/93)	Cemetery. R.T.S. proposed and A.J.C. seconded that a path be laid the full length of the cemetery. 11 votes in favour and 2 against. J.E.C. proposed and R.T.S. seconded that the path be one metre wide. 9 votes in favour 4 abstentions. Agreed to ask for quotes for three types of path: tarmac, compressed hoggin and slabs.
