I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

2. Matters Arising

377/91 <u>Tesco Roundabout</u>. The clerk had written again to Tesco (288/91) asking for a reply by mid November.

378/91 <u>Bund - Coulson Close</u>. Cork Gully were awaiting (336/91) confirmation from H. Rose that he would convey the land to M.P.C.

379/91 <u>I.V.C. Route.</u> A meeting ith various groups had been (337/91) arranged. Jim Paice M.P. also invited.

380/91 Youth Club. J.E.C. reported that two male leaders, one trained and one untrained had been appointed. One female leader had resigned.

H.M.S. to point out at Patch meeting that M.P.C. had guaranteed payment for two leaders to the end of March 1992.

381/91 Cricket Square. Repairs had been effected. M.P.C. to (340/91) send £250 to the Cricket Club as per 340/91.

382/91 <u>Tennis Courts.</u> The surrounds had been cultivated. (341/91) Seeding still to take place.

Bowls Green. The Water Company would not allow underground taps. R. Godden of the Bowls Club had offered to bring the taps above ground. Agreed. The cost of repair work exceeded the £850 provided by M.P.C. by £21.08 which amount Bowls Club had paid.
