I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

The chairman welcomed A.D.J.B. on behalf of the Council to the meeting. It was noted that W.D. Booth had resigned. A letter of thanks for his work would be sent.

1. 6989 Minutes of the meeting of 1 December 1986 having been circulated were confirmed and signed.

2. Matters Arising

- 6990 13th Public Drain. Although permission for a change of course (5509)had not been granted a cut was made in the 13th public drain into "Dickerson's" Pit in 1983.

 Now that the work on the 13th drain was completed the Environmental Services Officer would be asked to ensure that the cut was filled in in order to prevent possible pollution of the Pit.
- 6991 Car Park. Valuation no. 1 was received. R.T.S. proposed, G.P. seconded (6959) and all agreed that Council pay only for the work done namely £11,665.19. The clerk would query "additional" figures.

 Lavender and Bateman would be asked to remove the concrete posts north of the car park.

 It was agreed to wait for the completion of the car park before deciding whether the lighting was adequate, and whether a sleeping policeman was necessary.

 It was noted that there could be further problems with the ditch.
- 6992 Approach to Village. Shearline had expressed concern about parking (6960)problems. B.C.W. would suggest that the firm contact Mr. Kisby. The clerk would also try to contact Mr. Kisby by phone.
- 6993 <u>Gypsy Site</u>. The County Council were dealing with the rubbish problems. (6961)Although the bus had been moved lorries were blocking the right of way. The County Council would be informed.
- 6994 <u>Village Sign</u>. £112.97 had so far been donated and Napp had agreed (6963) to give up to £1000.

 A letter from a parishioner opposed to the dovecote sign was noted.
- 6995 Christmas. G.P. proposed, L.M.L. seconded and all agreed that (6968)£25 be donated to the Salvation Army, and that the "usual" donation be made to Mr. Flitton for transporting the tree.
- 3. 6996 Contract of Employment Manager, Community Centre. Due to its confidentiality this item was taken at the end of the meeting. R.T.S. proposed, R.J.F. seconded and all agreed that Council exclude all members of the public under the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960 for the purposes of discussing the contract of employment of the manager of the Community Centre. Council discussed the contract as prepared by its solicitor and recommended various alterations for the solicitor to study and comment upon.
- 4. 6997 Play Equipment, Coles Road Recreation Ground. L.M.L. proposed that the Play Committee meet to discuss the possibilities for new play equipment. G.P. agreed to serve on this Committee which

would report back to Council in due course. G.P. expressed concern about the safety aspect of the present equipment. L.M.L. would check.

Minutes of the Planning Sub Committee Meeting held on Monday 19th January 1987 at 7.30pm in the Community Centre.

Apologies were received from G. Patten, P. Harrold and P.D. Rice.

1. New Applications

- a) 7013 S/2395/86 E.J. Nicholas o.a. for two large houses on land adjacent to 60 Old School Lane using right of way adjacent to 44 Old School Lane. It was agreed that the logical access to this site should be adjacent to 60 Old School Lane (as per Inspector's Report 1984). There was no objection to two houses so long as the 60 Old School Lane access was used. The defined area in the application did not appear to accord with the map in the Milton Local Plan of 1985.
- b) 7014 S/2407/86 St. John's College o.a. erection of buildings for research and development innovation park objection. Council had consistently fought for this land to become green belt. There would be no objection however if only 12% of the whole site including the paddock (not included in this application) were to be developed.
- c) 7015 S/2414/86 Perrys offices for building society agency and solicitors offices at 6 High Street concern about street parking. It was thought preferable for houses in High Street to remain residential. The application contravened the Milton Plan (policy 19 para 4.09).
- 2. 7016 Middleton's Pit. Messrs. Januarys on behalf of their clients expressed concern about the different levels of soil between the filled in pit and Winship Industrial Estate and possible surface water drainage problems. The clerk would reply that the soil would be distributed and levelled with the recreation ground as soon as weather conditions improved. Apart from the landscaped mounding at the southern end there would be little difference in levels.

3. Decisions Received

7017 McMann Partitions, 97 Cambridge Road — industrial unit (6874) refused because of an undesirable intensification and overdevelopment of the site without adequate parking.
