### I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

### 207/95

### 1. Land adjacent A14.

(178/95)

It was agreed to ask the owner of the land to take the responsibility to prevent illegal access to the site by having a skip placed across the entrance (in the short term) and in the long term having a barrier or substantial lockable bollard erected. Council would also be willing to discuss purchase of the site.

As Mr Harris and Mrs Wilson did not attend it was agreed that RTS arrange a meeting between the chair vice chair and district councillor and Mr Harris to discuss the above.

The clerk to write to Chief Executive SCDC expressing Council's displeasure at the apparent lack of action - copies to Mrs Crandall, Planning Director and EHO, asking that SCDC use the enforcement notices to remove the travellers and any other powers available under various Acts. It was suggested that Council take out an injunction against Mrs Wilson under the Criminal Justices Act for causing a public nuisance. Advice to be sought from solicitor. The clerk to seek support from Tesco.

Noted that Mrs Wilson had asked SCDC to clear up the site the costs to be borne by her.

Agreed not to contribute towards costs of securing the site until it was in public ownership.

### 2. Crime Update

The police were aware of pornographic materials being discarded and also of the use of cannabis and possibly ecstasy. It was agreed that the Youth Committee discuss these issues with a view to setting up an information meeting for parents.

The crime rate in Milton was high. PC Parton was keen to involve Neighbourhood Watch schemes more closely in helping prevent crime. A "Safer Villages Initiative" was being tried in Cottenham. If successful PC Parton would ask for the scheme to be used in Milton. PC Parton would produce monthly crime figures for RLEW to disseminate.

232/95 Development off The Sycamores

(115/95) The clerk had passed on to SCDC a resident's concern about the removal of hedging at the boundary of the site. The planning authority were investigating.

233/95 <u>Illuminated Sign Tadpole Technology</u>

Office block car parking and conversion of part mailroom to distribution at Press Hall and land adjoining Winship Road The premises to be occupied by Cambridge Newspapers. Condition of "Business Use" occupancy imposed to safeguard the policies of the Structure plan and the South Cambs Local Plan. Landscaping scheme to be approved. Space for 95 cars to be parked to be laid out prior to development. Shrubs at Winship Road/Cambridge Road to be trimmed back to improve visibility for pedestrians/cyclists. Shrubs to be regularly trimmed.

236/95 F Pascuzzi extension at 3 High street approved.

(116/95) Permanent space on site to be reserved for parking. Details of external materials to be used to be approved. (see also min: 195/95).

237/95 PR Nuttall change of use to golf practice centre including club house golf course and driving bays at Penfold Farm refused.

Contrary to Policy P20/4 of the Structure Plan and Policy GB3/1 of the Cambridge Green Belt Plan in that whilst outdoor sports are acceptable in a Green Belt location Policy GB3/2 only permits development in the open countryside where it will not adversely affect the rural and open nature of the area. The Planning Authority considered the proposal as still detrimental to the open and rural character of the area, a form of development not ancillary to the use of the land as a golf course and therefore not appropriate in the Green Belt.
