I. PLANNING COMMITTEE

3023 Tree Planting Scheme 1976/77 - M.W. has placed orden and mill implade a horse (2991) chestnut for the village green.

3024 Gray Conoley Land - Mr. Barker of 72, Coles Road has volunteered to provide (2993) a suitable 'digger' when convenient to clear the pathways himself without any charge.

3025 New Notice Board - ordered from Diver of Impington - delivery by end of (2995) September has been promised.

3026 Parish Banks - KPH (Clerk to the Trustees) has sought advice from Mr. Martindale (2999) on legal aspects of the gift involved.

3027 Auditor's Comments

- (a) Fidelity guarantee insurance cover should be increased to $\pounds 4000.00$ and it was agreed that this should be implemented.
- (b) Crossed cheques should be used. The Clerk has ordered a new book.
- (c) Loose-leaf minute books should have the pages numbered and initialled by the Chairman.
- (d) In the account book a separate column should be incorporated for VAT.
- (e) The Council should consider reducing the balance in hand at the next precept stage.
- (f) Parish Banks situation KPH reported that no further progress has been made on negotiations.
- 3028 SCDC Circular concerning Parish Drainage Status advising that extensions to the Cambridge Sewage Treatment Works are likely to be completed in 1978. The Anglian Water Authority would not object to new development provided that prior agreement was reached preventing occupancy before the date of completion of the extensions.
- 3029 County Structure Plan a report will be forwarded by the Planning Committee for the County following initial surveys carried out. Further comments will be requested to be submitted before November 1st.
- 3030 County Land Agent has advised the Council that the Smallholdings amounting to 12.581 ACRES would be subject to a rent increase to £144 per annum effective from 11th October 1976. The Clerk was instructed to notify allotment tenants that rents would be increased in direct proportion to the revision involved (i.e. \times 149/88).
- 3031 Closure of Butt Lane village side. Mr. J. Cornwell from the County Surveyor's (3009) Department was welcomed to the meeting by the Chairman and he explained that the proposal submitted to the Council had also been circulated to other interested parties for comment e.g. Police, Post Office etc. The plan is at present in the "pre-consultation" stages with the Road Construction Unit. Various ideas and suggestions were exchanged as the Chairman invited the 7 Milton residents in attendance to join the discussion which proved to be most helpful.

 Mr. Cornwell and the residents then left the meeting and the Clerk was instructed to write to the County Surveyor with the following statement:-
 - 1. The complete closure of Butt Lane from the East approach is acceptable.
 - 2. It is understood that the "paddock" area between the crossing gate and the by-pass itself would be open for access for agricultural traffic, but that the cycle way would be closed by means of barriers or cycle posts at the end closest to the by-pass to prevent cyclists getting up to any speed and therefore going straight across the road.
 - 3. Concerning the western side of Butt Lane it was recommended that a restriction of 'no entry except for access' should be imposed.
- The question of the movement of the "Children's Crossing Attendant" from the High Street to the By-pass/Butt Lane crossing was discussed. It was felt that crossing the de-trunked A10 could still be dangerous and the matter should be deferred until construction work has been completed.

3034 <u>Community Council Guide Sheets</u> are available on various topics of possible interest to the Council. The Clerk would request a copy of each sheet for further information.

The Annual Meeting of the Cambridgeshire Association of Local Councils will be held on October 2nd 1976. RTS and Pk will represent the Council if able to attend.

- Future of the Bus Service upon completion of the by-pass(es) was queried by MEJ the Clerk was asked to write to Eastern Counties Omnibus Company for further comment on whether or not the existing stops would be changed for the 109 Service.
- Conversion of Street Lighting the County Surveyor has forwarded a circular to advise that later this year it was planned to convert existing lamps to sodium with photo electric cell control thereby achieving dusk to dawn lighting with greater efficiency of output but using less electricity.
- Filing Cabinet for the Clerk the Chairman asked if this matter could be dealt with at the next meeting to provide the opportunity to check possible sources for a used cabinet.
- Parking of Taxi opposite Wagon & Horses some complaints have been made regarding the parking of the taxi near to the bus shelter. The owner is at present having alterations carried out to his property and further action will be deferred until work has been completed and the situation can then be reviewed.

This concluded the business and the Chairman closed the meeting.
