JANUARY 7, 1975, at 7.45 p.m.

Present: HWHE, RTS, BCW, MEJ; Apology from Chmn. & Vice-Chmn.

The Clerk apologised for it being his fault that the meeting was late strtg.

2563 CHAIRMAN OF THE MEETING On the Clerk cllg. for nominations, Mr. Summerfield unanimously elected on prop: MEJ, sec. HWHE.

2564 TIME OF COMMENCEMENT OF FUTURE MEETINGS Prop: RTS sec: BCW, that Mtgs. begin at 7.30 p.m. Agreed unanimously.

2565 Circ. Minutes of December 3, confirmed & signed

MATTERS ARISING.

2566 PARISH BANKS (2560) Letter being awaited from Solicitors; Agreed to defer any action meanwhile.

2567 PRECEPT 1975/76 Council reviewed. likely expenditure, being particularly aware it was difficult to estimate amount of likely contribution towards the changing rooms in present circumstances of inflationary building costs... In hand at Bank: about £6,000; Product of 1p Rate: £2,259.

Prop: MEJ, Sec: HWHE, & agreed unan. to Precept for £3,000.
The necessary Precept was accordingly signed.

2568 CHANGING ROOMS (2530) Arising from the above discussion this matter to go on the Agenda for next meeting and Chairman of the Working Party be asked for a Report.

2569 MILTON BY-PASS SPECIAL MEETINGS (2562) The Clerk reported as recorded in Minutes (2562) Council agreed on following comments to be put to ERCU:

- (2562/1) Eastern Route: to be forwarded but with reservations
- (2562/2) Butt Lane & Landbeach rd, junctn: to ask for subways or footbridges
- (2562/4) Tree screening: supported - esp. near residential areas.

Closure of A10 footpath, Milton to Kings Hedges raised by a resident since the meeting; suggests will cause hardship to pedestrians & cyclists if the footpath diverted via slip road and interchange (nr. Bene't Farm); both peds. & cyc. traffic between K.H. 'bus stop and Milton factory site, and by residents walking from Milton to K.H. (and reverse) to use the more convenient and more frequent 195 'bus service: 109 particularly poor in evenings between 8.30 & 10.45 when no 'bus at all.

(2562/5) Full support for the By-pass in principle: while putting forward above suggestions to be emphasised that the Council not in any way objecting to the building of the By-pass.

2570 STOKES ENFORCEMENT APPEAL (2555) The Clerk read the official notice from the County Secretary of the Public Local Inquiry at Shire Hall on Thursday, 30 January, 1975 at 10.00 a.m. into Appeals by: OLIVER RIX Ltd; STOKES OF CAMBRIDGE Ltd; MALL INVESTMENTS Ltd against Enforcement Notices relating to breach of planning control - viz: erection of Nissen Hut, concrete base, storing of scrap & building materials, old vehicles, constructing a road and failure to comply with a condition imposed in planning permission requiring demolition of another bldg.

Agreed on prop: BCW, sec: MEJ, that Clerk reps. the Council at the Inquiry and that he prepare a case based on the discussion with Mr. Sillery, Dec.17. (2555)

Note: Council very carefully considered the two letters sent by Mr. Nicholas with the two preceding applications pointing out the 'planning blight' which prevented him developing the land and expressed sympathy with this view, but took also into account present planning policy for the land and therefore commented as above in each case.

2578 SPECIAL MILTON BY-PASS MEETING (2569&2562)

A MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL AND ERCU ENGINEERING STAFF in the VILLAGE HALL on MONDAY, JANUARY 13, 1975 at 2.30 p.m.

Present: Mr.E.C.Daisley, Mr.Pursley & Miss Julie Wood of ERCU; P.C: DP (Chmn) MEJ,BCW,HWHE,LMF,PK,RTS, & Clerk.

The following points arising from members' and residents' observations on the latest Milton By-pass proposals were discussed and the views of the Engineering Staff obtained.

2578/1 Suggested Eastern Route - The Clerk explained this had been put forward by a resident and the Council had reservations. Mr.D. said it had, at one time, been considered and they wd. look at it again.

2578/2 Butt Lane junction - This was prob. the point of greatest concern (2562/2) to the village as there would soon be an attendance of schoolchildren at Impington College near 100. Although a 'bus now ran if the number of children using it fell off in the summer cost to parents would rise and their children were entitled to cycle.

The relative merits of a subway, footbridge or closure of Butt Lane were discussed; the latter would increase the distance to over 3 miles and an Education Committee 'bus might then be available.

Mr. D. said the closure of Butt Lane (as suggested by the County Surveyor earlier) was a distinct possibility and it would be seriously considered again.
