I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

- 1. 6219 New Recreation Ground. B.C.W. welcomed K. Moore to the meeting. He explained that he had spoken to Mr. Sheppard of Melbourn Properties, who was not prepared at this stage to give any undertakings since his firm had not yet exercised its option to buy the land in question. It would probably be 18 months to 2 years before Mr. Sheppard exercised that option.

 Mr. Moore agreed to write to Mr. Sheppard explaining that the M.P.C. are prepared to negotiate the exact position of the recreation ground as soon as his firm has bought the land.
- 2. 6220 Community Centre. Plans of the general layout of the Centre had been received. S. Poulter attended and commented that the architects had met all of council's requirements and that the layout was a fair compromise between the ideal and what could be afforded.

 The clerk would see Johnson and Bailey with observations concerning the entrance doors and roof lights.

 B.C.W. thanked S.B.P. for attending.
- 3. 6221 The minutes of the meeting held on 3 December 1984 having been circulated were confirmed and signed.

4. Matters Arising

- 6222 Shirley Lodge. The D. of E. Historic Building Investigator (6177) although considering Shirley Lodge and wall of historic interest felt that they were no longer suitable for the statutory list since they had been badly affected by modern alterations.
- 6223 Fen Road Crossing. British Rail had promised to put down (6194) the "Stop Line" and have the seat repaired. There appeared to be no faults in the signalling circuits.

 G.P. was concerned about the rubble etc., left behind between the drift road and crossing.

 The clerk would ask B.R. to tidy up the site.
- 6224 Christmas Carols. The tree had cost £15.00. B.C.W. thanked
 (6198) those who collected and put up the tree; also those who took
 it down.
 A.D.J.B. would find out if Mr. Flitton wanted paying. G.P.
 proposed and all agreed that if not council would buy Mr. Flitton
 and A.D.J.B. a bottle of whisky each for their help in
 transporting and erecting tree.
- 6225 <u>Gypsy Site</u>. The clerk reported that K.P.H. had received a (6204) letter from Mrs. Letley stating that if the County Council decided against proceeding with the Gypsy Site then the land would be sold.
- 6226 <u>Path Repairs</u>. Repairs to the path outside the baker's shop (6211) had been carried out. Messrs. Kernhow and Co., had agreed to pay.

5. 6227 Middleton's Pit. Few & Kester's final bill for the completion of the purchase of Middleton's Pit totalled £6,908.55 made up thus:-
