I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

1. 42/94 <u>Village Policing</u>. Inspector Hayes and P.C. Gent attended. (404/93) Inspector Hayes explained that he had 33 officers to cover 64 parishes with a population of 87000. Bottisham, Papworth and Histon police stations had 24 hour coverage. He needed to balance the demands of the Citizen's Charter (emergency response within 18 minutes) with a visible police presence on patrol. No village in this area had one exclusive full time policeman. The average size of beat per officer was 7 to 11,000 people. Size of population, levels of crime, geography and other particular local features on the beat decided how officers were to be delegated. It would be at least 2-3 years before he could have extra officers if any. The introduction of Parish Special Constables would be one way of providing visible policing. A trial scheme in Bottisham was due to be reviewed in May/June. If it proved effective Inspector Hayes would look to extend the scheme. He felt that Special Constables were the key to visible policing. At present Milton had nine, three of whom worked in the rural division and six in the city. D.T.W. thanked both Ibspector Hayes and P.C. Gent for attending.

43/94 Minutes. After making amendements to the minutes D.T.W. signed them as a true record.

Matters Arising

44/94 Spinney r/o Eastern Electricity. D.T.W. had attended a meeting to discuss this site. Little progress to date.

45/94 <u>Cemetery Entrance</u>. R.R. reported the York stone entrance (247/93) to be still unsafe. The clerk to take necessary action.

46/94 Travellers' Site adjacent A45. The clerk to complain (151/93) to the County Council about the state of this site.

47/94 Play Equipment. S.C.D.C. had received a query about the (412/93) play equipment on the open space at The Sycamores. The clerk to reply that Council had installed this equipment as part of the overall plan for open spaces throughout Milton.

48/94 <u>Telephone Kiosk A10</u>. Department of Transport would need (3/94) to assess the site, - the A10 being a trunk road.

49/94 <u>Coles Road Recreation Ground</u>. Agreed that D.T.W. could (6/94) sign the conveyance as soon as it was ready.

- 5. 59/94 Grass Cutting. Two quotations were received. R.D. proposed A.J.C. seconded and all agreed that Council accept Paul Ferguson's quotation for a period of three years subject to rises in inflation.

74/94 D.R. Merry, 266 The Rowans addition of radio (392/93) transmitting aerials and rotator to existing mast approved. The mast to be extended when transmitting and/or receiving radio signals. At all other times to be kept in its lowered position.

75/94 S. Compton, 10 Butt Lane - 2 storey extension refused (35/94) as it would adversely affect the amenities of neighbours either side, cutting out light and sunlight to the house and their gardens and appearing dominant and overwhelming to those properties.

77/94 S/1512/91 M. Gooch, 16 High Street amendment to (404/91) position of garage. No comments.

Garage and wall would be obtrusive and detract from open character of this group of houses. Wall between 18 and 18A could restrict access to garage of number 18. Concern that work was proceeding prior to planning permission being given.

79/94 S/0056/94 Bard Pharmaceuticals Renewal of permission for Sports and Social Club till December 31st 1997.
No objections.
