MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE VILLAGE HALL. ON TUESDAY, MARCH 7th 1967 at 7.30 pm There were present: Mr. D. Pearson, Chairman, Messrs J.S. Doggett, L.M. Forbes, J.W.R. Lewis, E.J. Walkling, A.W. Wenham together with the Clerk. 1239 <u>MINUTES</u> (1219) The circulated minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on January 24th., 1967, were confirmed and signed by the Chairman. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES. Speed of traffic in Built-up Area (1190) - The Clerk reported that he had written direct to the Minister of Trans-**%200** port, Mrs Barbara Castle, who had passed his letter to the Divisional Engineer for direct reply. Waste Land. Coles Road (1220) The Clerk read replies from 1241 Messrs Theodore, Goddard and Co., acting for Messrs Gray, Connolly which included a plan of proposed housing development in Old School Lane, adjoining the piece of land, the subject of negotiation. Before they expressed any opinion the Council wished to know more precise details of the density and the Clerk was instructed to ask for this. Landbeach Road Cemetery (1223) - The Clerk reported that he had written, on Jnuary 31st last offering the Council's 1242 further help, as instructed, in cutting the hedgerowa but had received no reply at all. The Chairman said he had taken the opportunity when the hedge-cutting machine was in the village, of having these hedges cut and Mr. Fred Fee Pearson, of Westwick Hall Farm, Oakington, had very kindly done this free of charge to the Council. It was unanimously agreed that a letter of thanks be ser to the Fouleatson. <u>Maintenance of 'Bus Shelter Lighting</u> (1226) - The Clerk submitted an estimate from Eastern Electricity as follows: 1243 'Cleaning fittings twice a year, repairing faulty bulbs and minor repairs to wiring, in both shelters for the sum of £2 9 8 per annum, to be paid in quarterly instalments and subject to contract between Eastern Electricity and the Council' On the proposition of Mr. Forbes, seconded by Mr. Lewis, the Clerk was instructed to accept this. PARISH COUNCILS' ASSOCIATION, WINTER CONFERENCE. 1244 The Clerk gave a brief report on a most interesting meeting at Witchford, on 4th. February, 1967. The meeting was concerned with overcoming poor attendance at Parish Meeting solving the problems of parking on grass verges and how loc villages would fit into an expanding Esat Anglia. REVIEW OF VILLAGE HALL COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT. 1245 The Clerk submitted a very brief summary of accounts supplied by the Secretary.

Mr. L.M. Forbes proposed and Mr. A.W. Wenham seconded that

the Committee of Management be re-imbursed for the deficit on the Village Hall of £22 3 9. On the proposition of Mr. J.S.Doggett, seconded by Mr. Lewis, it was agreed that they also be re-imbursed with the cost of gang mowers in the sum of £90 - making a total of £112 3 9.

It was agreed that the Committee of Management be granted a further year's management of the Village Hall as from January 1st., 1967 under the same conditions.

BUILDING OF NEW VILLAGE HALL (1230).

A lengthy discussion took place on the plans for the new Hall with particular consideration of the temporary nature of planning permission obtained about which some concern was felt. It was decided to go ahead with these plans.

Regarding the sale of the old VillageHall site, the Clerk quoted Minute 1054. The Clerk was instructed to find out if the 'betterment levy' of 40% to be payable under new legislation to come into operation April 6th. next, would apply to this property which is held freehold by the Council.
