N.E. Ashman change of use to hair and beauty salon (104/93) at 10 High Street refused. Use of one pair of semi detached houses detrimental to the amenities enjoyed by no. 12 through noise and disturbance by frequent movement of visitors and staff to and from the premises. Off street parking inadequate would aggravate existing difficulties already caused by on-street parking on busy and heavily trafficked section of road - would prejudice free flow and safety of traffic in High Street.

212/93 (139/93) W. Jayyousi change of use to Pizza Home Delivery Service and take away at 68 High Street approved until June 30th 1994. Premises to be open for business between 1700 and 2300 hours Monday to Saturday. Parking area at rear to be kept for parking of cars.

Details of any power driven plant or equipment for heating, ventilation, control of odour and fumes to be submitted and approved by S.C.D.C.

213/93 (143/93) Childrens Hospice Extensions approved.

214/93 (179/93) J. Jefford erection of light industrial unit following demolition of cottage at Rose Cottage Chesterton Fen Road approved. Materials to be identical with those used for existing building. "Rose Cottage" to be demolished and cleared from site before any building works commencing. Surface water drainage system to be approved. All foul sewage or trade effluent to be discharged to the foul sewer.

Vehicle loading bays and storage areas including chemicals not to be connected to surface water drainage system.

An inspection/sampling chamber to be connected between septic tank and soakaway system.

All fuel, chemical storage tanks and equipment to be

contained within an impervious bunded area. All drums and small containers for oil to be stored in bunded area which do not drain to watercourse etc.

Surface water from roads and parking areas to be discharged via trapped gullies.

Details of any power driven plant and equipment to be submitted and approved by S.C.D.C.

Northern Fringe. Possible future road schemes likely to remove all landscaping leaving the proposed car parking on the edge of the road.
