Netting to prevent tennis/footballs from straying into the Sheltered Housing site should be paid for by SCDC/CHS. ILD also pointed out that the architect should be aware of possible problems from the hardcourt floodlights shining into the flats.

Concerns about how the existing mobile warden scheme might be affected were voiced.

Agreed to ask Social Services to clarify their input into this scheme.

DTW expressed the view that Milton had been let down by SCDC and that they had finally agreed to consider integrating Walkling Way after many requests from MPC.



It was agreed by all that the access road if not adopted should remain the ownership of Council and leased to CHS for maintenance.
