#### I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

1.411/88 Minutes of the meeting of 3rd October and 10th October 1988 having been circulated were confirmed and signed as a true record.

Minutes of the Public Meeting had been circulated.

E.M.C.D. felt that a footnote should be added to explain a point made at the meeting. This matter to be dealt with at the next meeting.

### 2. Matters Arising

- 412/88 Tompkins Mead. The Conservation Corps were unable to (261/88) pollard willow trees at Tompkins Mead.

  The clerk would find out if the farm school could provide this service.
- 413/88 <u>Trees</u>. Trees were due to be planted in December on (262/88) Coles Road recreation ground, Fen Road; and along the old A10 by the industrial estate, 1989/8490.
- 414/88 <u>I.V.C. Governors</u>. J.F.C.F. had been co-opted on to the (318/88)governing body.
- 415/88 Play Areas. The clerk would contact Mr. Hellingsworth (354/88) again re landscaping of the Twigden play area.

  Open Space. There seemed still to be little progress.

  J.F.C.f. proposed Council write to Mr. Sheppard expressing disappointment at the delay. If nothing was forthcoming Council would consider taking further action by informing Tesco of the problem in getting promises fulfilled and possibly going further by publicising the position. It was agreed to seek Mr. Evans' advice before taking any action.

J.E.C. expressed concern at how Council would pay Mumby

- (359/88) supported moves for a footbridge over the A45 but the Department of Transport would need to fund the scheme.

  It was hoped that the agreement could be reached to enable the overall cycleway/pedestrian scheme to be completed by March 1989.
- 418/88 Dog Fouling. As yet D.A.R. had not received any posters. (360/88)
- 419/88 Shopping Trip. The clerk had managed to obtain the (365/88) Waterbeach Scout group minibus for two trips before

Christmas. Thanks to S.J.D. for driving the minibus. J.F.C.F. was due to drive for the second trip.

- 420/88 Public Meeting Dispensing. E.M.C.D. proposed that the (389/88) result of the public meeting be sent to the chairman of Tesco with a copy of the letter to the F.P.C.

  There was one vote in favour, four against and four abstentions.
- 421/88 <u>Joint Meeting October 24th</u>. J.F.C.F. now had five members (408/88) on the new committee. He would keep Council informed of progress.
- 3. 422/88 Country Park. A report of the Public Inquiry was (3/3/88) produced by R.D. and circulated.
  L.M.L. thanked R.D. for attending.
- 4. 423/88 Landscaping New Recreation Ground. R.J.F. proposed R.D. seconded and all agreed that Council apply for permission to amend the landscaping as per the decision of the meeting of July 18th.

## 5. 424/88 Elderly

a) Services for the Elderly. I.W.C. proposed R.D. seconded and all agreed that the factsheet be photocopied and delivered to every house in the village.

M.L. offered to deliver it with the "Focus."

b) Sheltered Housing. It was agreed that the clerk write to S.C.D.C. expressing concern about the absence of sheltered housing in Milton and that Council would welcome any ideas that would lead to the establishment of sheltered housing.

# 6. 425/88 Site Visit

a) Allotments. Following the visit the clerk had asked T. Rumble to clear those allotments not let.

This action was confirmed and the clerk would advertise the spare plots.

A report in the C.E.N. suggested the possibility of the Farm College land being sold for residential use.

It was agreed that Council support the retention of the Farm College in Milton.

- b) <u>Cemetery</u>. The clerk had asked T. Rumble to clear rubbish from the cemetery. This was confirmed. The problem of moles would be looked at in spring 1989.

Mr. Mumby was aware of water lying on part of the ground and anticipated looking at the site in Spring 1989.
