I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

1. 412/92 Minutes of November 2nd had been circulated. Amendments were made to minute 386/92. The minutes were then confirmed and signed.

2. Matters Arising

413/92 S.C.D.C. Local Plan. Proposed moficiations were received (164/92) and noted. Agreed to make no further comments.

Village Maintenance. It was noted that the County Council intended to restrict the application of weedkiller to one approved contractor employed by the Highways Department. Rates for grass cutting previously undertaken by the County Council were therefore revised to £840.00 plus £8 for extra areas on The Rowans (Beazer Homes Development). P. Ferguson to be informed.

415/92 <u>Library</u>. As from January 28th 1993 it was noted that (357/92) the mobile library would be sited at the Community Centre every Thursday.

416/92 <u>Cambridge News Building</u>. Landscaoing was now in question. (377/92) Agreed to await developments.

417/92 <u>Trees</u>. Thanks to all who helped plant trees. (382/92) It was noted that the obligation to replant at The Sycamores ceased in December 1992.

418/92 Open Spaces
(383/92) Beazer Homes. Completion had now taken place - £3500 commuted sum received.

Costain Homes. It was noted that Costain Homes had agreed to transfer their open spaces together with a commuted sum of £40,000. Necessary replanting to be carried out during present planting season by Costain/Bryant.

Traffic Calming. According to Mr. D. Brace of the (384/92) County Council the request for a pedestrian crossing was now 18th (in the County). Sites for traffic calming had been inspected. Milton was not considered one of the priority areas. A scheme (to be first approved by the County Council) would be allowed if M.P.C. were to pay the full costs. N.B. cost of Fen Ditton scheme approx. £50,000). Agreed to await report of experimental schemes analysed by the Transport

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Research Laboratory. Report due out early 1993.
A letter was received from Eastern Electricity
detailing their efforts to ease traffic problems in
the village. Thanks to Eastern Electricity recorded.

420/92 (385/92) Rowing Lake. A letter from C.P.R.E. was received suggesting that little action could be taken to challenge the decision by S.C.D.C. to approve the change of use.

The Department of the Environment had decided that the Secretary of State would not be justified in using his powers of intervention on this occasion.

D.T.W., R.T.S. and J.F.C.F. had met with the architects who were prepared to meet Council on site as soon as more detailed plans were available. An alternative scheme to avoid the diversion of Fen Road had been suggested by the architects.

A letter from the Cambridge Preservation Society suggested a different line for the rowing course and protection for Car Dyke, Fen Road and the Fen Drift; also that considerations of vehicular access, siting of boathouses and embanking should be subject to separate consultation.

R.D. proposed and J.E.C. seconded that Council write to the Conservation Committee of S.C.D.C. objecting to any scheme that involved in its proposals any loss of the meadows and Fen Drift. D.T.W. proposed an amendment that a copy of the letter from C.P.S. be sent to the Conservation Committee with copies to C.P.R.E. and The Rowing Trust as it reflected Council's opinion in the main. Agreed. Council felt unable to comment on the alternative scheme (above) without seeing detailed plans though would consider any plan that did not involve the diversion of Fen Road.

- 421/92 Care for the Elderly. J.F.C.F. hoped to report back in (386/92) February. S.J.S. was concerned about possible use of grounds of Milton Hall and referred to Policy Milton 1 p. 140 of the S.C.D.C. Local Plan Deposit 1989.
- 422/92 <u>Combine Against Crime</u>. D.T.W. and the clerk had attended the launch of a scheme organised by S.C.D.C. and the Police against crime. To be discussed at January meeting.
- 3. 423/92 <u>Co-option</u>. Four candidates were interested in standing (375/92) for the casual vacancy. Mr. R. Waters was elected.
- 4. 424/92 Country Park Update. On target to open in April. A mobile sculpture was proposed for the site for a six month trial period. Council would wait till the end of this period before making any comments.

 S.C.D.C. intended reviewing the noise barrier along the A45. Budgetary and Department of Transport requirements needed consideration.

 Council's thanks were recorded to R.D., J.F.C.F. and R.T.S. for their hard work at committee.
- 5. 425/92 Water Main. R.J.F. proposed J.F.C. seconded and all agreed that Council accept the Water Company's offer of £2088 compensation less £639.70 (balance owing for car park works) a total of £1448.30 (plus VAT subject to confirmation from Water Company). Agreed also that R.D. ask B. Cox and P. Ferguson for costs of trees and planting scheme having been agreed with J. Hellingsworth.

- 6. 426/92 Precept 1993/4. Precept to be paid in two instalments
 April 12th 1993 and June 23rd 1993. Finance Committee
 to meet in January.
- 7. 427/92

 M.C.C. R.J.F. proposed J.F.C.F. seconded and all agreed to pay £3500 to M.C.C. (as there had been no large bills). Agreed also to pay quarterly any balance remaining after payment of large items. Noted that there was £3492 still to pay by March 31st.

 Agreed not to pay wages for cleaning annexe.
- 8. 428/92 Play Area Humphries Way. The Play Committee produced a scheme for Humphries Way open space.

 J.f.C.f. proposed R.J.f. seconded and all agreed that Council proceed with this scheme £4724 for supply and installation from Playdale as soon as the land is acquired. Agreed also to have a seat and bin installed by City Services.
- 9. 429/92 Auditor's Report. The Auditor queried whether P. Ferguson was VAT registered. The clerk confirmed that he was not.
- 10. 430/92 Christmas. Mr. Bland of Willow Crescent had offered a tree. Agreed to accept the offer and to put up the tree on December 12th.
- 11. 431/92 "No Dogs" Signs. J.F.C.F. proposed R.D. seconded and (348/92)all agreed to accept J.J. Hall's quotation of £110 for erecting seven signs.

2. Matters Arising

439/92 <u>Dental Surgery</u>. Two plans relating to the revisions of (398/92) the means of access and patients' parking spaces were received.

3. Decisions Received

440/92 <u>Gas Flare & Electricity Generation Scheme - Landfill Site</u>. (278/92) Scheme approved by County Council subject to compliance with specified maximum noise levels when measured at nearest property.

441/92 Travellers Site off Kings Hedges Road. Upgrading of site approved, subject to approval by County Planning Authority of materials for external walls and roofs of amenity blocks and warden's office. Conditions also of surface water drainage and storage of oil. No car breaking and no scrap materials to be stored on site. Landscaping scheme to be approved. Development to be started within 5 years.



442/92 R.F. Clarke, 29 Willow Crescent Extension approved. (368/92)

443/92 Mrs. Badcock, Mrs. Waterson, Mr. Waterson and (369/92) Mr. Housden bungalow r/o 20/22 Cambridge Road refused. Long and inconvenient access would result in loss of amenity to neighbours at 20 and 22 Cambridge Road. Noise and disturbance especially to no. 22 would result from traffic movements.

444/92 L.S. Chapman, 78 Coles Road extensions approved. (370/92)

445/92 Plot 1 adjacent 60 Old School Lane for Mrs. and Mrs. (407/92) Valdini. Boarding of side window in study approved.

4. New Applications

446/92 Mr. and Mrs. D. Evans. Garage at 16 High Street.
(404/91) Amendment - garage increased in length and provision of visibility splay. No objections. (5/1512/91).

J.M. Barrett 37 High Street - moving the entrance (419/89) and variations on parking positions. No comments. (5/1624/89).

448/92 S/0090/92 T.G. Building 4 bungalows r/o 30 High Street. (408/92) The Planning Committee S.C.D.C. objected to floor slab level of Plot 4 and asked that it be lowered, but because of the high water table this was not possible. Although M.P.C. supported the neighbour's objections to an amendment to reduce the height of the ceiling and to lower roof pitch the Planning Committee had agreed reluctantly to this modification.

449/92 S/1605/92 Cambs. County Council - erection of 2 jackleg units and retention of existing units (total 8) for educational purposes at Cambs. College of Agriculture and Horticulture. No objections.

450/92 S/1646/92 Anglia Wholesaleing - change of use to Wholesale Warehouse and distribution - Warehouse at Winship Industrial Estate. No objections.

451/92 S/1653/92 R. Rose, 14 Fox's Close - utility room extension. No objections.

452/92 S/1670/92 Scion Health Ltd Buildings 208/9 Science Park extensions and minor alterations. Some concern about gradual erosion of 'green areas' by buildings, extensions and car parking.

5/1706/92 G. Moore and others. Sunningdale Park Chesterton Fen Road. Change of use of vacant land to site for travelling families.

J.E.C. proposed that M.P.C. object. R.E.S. seconded. 8 votes in favour 2 against and 21 abstentions. Contrary to Policy 36 Milton Local Plan and South Cambs Local Plan Deposit Draft 1989. Contrary to

Policy 20/4 of Cambs. Structure Plan re: Green Belt. Query also whether this application is in accordance with Policy P5/7 of the Structure Plan - development to be restricted to certain occupations. A strong letter of protest to be sent also that this site, although well run, was allowed to develop and to ask that no further sites be allowed.

454/92 S/1712/92 Mr. Pascuzzi r/o 1, 3, 7 High Street dwelling (o.a. 5/0603/91). Concerned about size of dwelling and its effect on and relationship to surrounding properties.

5/1753/92 Ely Diocesan Board of Finance o.a. land adjoining Milton Hospice - residential.

Concerned that this land is within the conservation area and that there are T.P.O's on trees there.

Additional housing in this area should be linked to the Hospice and not for private dwelling.

5. Any Other Planning Business

(197/90) Cambridge Regional College. A copy of correspondence between Impington Parish Council and the County and South Cambs District Councils about possible parking problems at the above site (application S/0730/90 Phase 2) was received and noted.
