

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN  
THE VILLAGE HALL ON TUESDAY, 8TH OCTOBER, 1963, AT 7.30 P.M.

803. MINUTES.

The Minutes of the meeting held on 31st July, 1963, were read, confirmed by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

804. PARISH GUIDE.

The Forbes agreed to explore the possibility of interesting a sufficient number of people to advertise in the proposed Parish Guide in order to make the venture self supporting, and to report to the next meeting.

805. WAR MEMORIAL.

It was agreed that the estimate from Messrs. Rattee & Kett, Limited, for cleaning and repairing the War Memorial in the sum of £.26. 0s. 0d. be accepted.

Regarding the re-erection of the War Memorial it was agreed a Public Meeting be called for Tuesday, 22nd October, in order to ascertain the wishes of the parish as to a suitable site.

806. RECREATION GROUND - (a) CONSTITUTION. On the proposition of Mr. E. J. Walkling, seconded by Mr. S. A. Siggs, it was agreed that the Constitution as submitted be adopted. A copy of the Constitution is annexed to these Minutes.

(b) PREPARATION OF GROUND. The Clerk reported that the only estimate received for the preparation, seeding and fencing of the ground in the sum of £633. 3s. 6d. from Rampton Cultivations Limited, and the estimate from Messrs. Gray, Conoley and Company Limited in the sum of £220. 0s. 0d. for constructing a 12 ft. roadway to the ground from Coles Road, had been submitted to Chesterton Rural District Council for grant purposes. Mr. L. M. Forbes reported that the Rural District Council had approved half the expenditure and had forwarded the estimates to Cambridgeshire County Council for their consideration.

An estimate received from Cambridge Water Company in the sum of £65. 6s. 0d. for laying on a water supply to the Recreation Ground was accepted.

VILLAGE HALL

(a) Caretaker. The Clerk submitted a letter from Mrs. K. Edwards asking that her present rate of 7s. Od. per week be increased in view of the extra number of lettings. On the proposition of Mr. J. S. Doggett, seconded by Mrs. D. Pearson, it was agreed that Mrs. Edwards be paid the sum of 5s. Od. per letting for cleaning the hall and lighting the fire during the period 1st October to 31st March, and that this rate be further reviewed in April.

(b) Mr. Wenham reported that Milton Laundry had laundered the curtains without charge. It was agreed that the thanks of the Council be conveyed to the proprietors.

INFANT WELFARE CLINIC.

Mr. J. S. Doggett renewed his plea that the Council give support to a petition signed by a number of mothers which had been sent to the Medical Officer of Health urging that an Infant Welfare Clinic be set up in the village. It was agreed to support the petition and the Clerk was instructed accordingly.

Concern was expressed at the speed of traffic entering the village from the northern end. On the proposition of Mr. L. M. Forbes, seconded by Mr. S. A. Biggs, it was agreed that the County Surveyor be requested to move the speed restriction signs to a point further north in order to allow traffic to slow down to the requisite speed before entering the village.
