he could find suitable accommodation, he would in the meantime be living at Histon.

850. IMPINGTON VILLAGE COLLEGE.

Mrs. Pearson reported that 673 pupils attended the College and despite earlier misgivings the grammar stream was progressing successfully. The G.C.E. results had been very satisfactory. 'he Open Day, when parents could meet the teachers and discuss their children's progress, had been well attended. 'he school library was very well stocked and some 5,300 books had been borrowed last term. The Parent Teachers Association was not as well supported as had been hoped, and Mrs. Pearson appealed for greater support from parents. The Association was doing very good work in raising money for various projects - the latest being in respect of a swimming pool.

The Adult Education classes, although not very well attended, were of a varied nature and worthy of more support.

851. OVER 60's CLUB.

Mrs. Pearson reported another successful year. The membership was around 45, and the meetings were well attended.

The Minutes of the meeting held on 20th January, 1964 were read, confirmed by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES.

852.

Resiting of War Memorial - The Clerk reported that the War Memorial had now been re-erected on the new site. The County Council had promised to lay a paved surround and this had yet to be completed.

853.

<u>Village Hall</u> - The Clerk reported that Messrs. Kirk (Cambridge) Limited had made an offer of £800 for the site of the present Village Hall, subject to planning permission and Contract.

2/

The Clerk also submitted an application from Chesterton Rural District Council to Cambridgeshire County Council for permission to erect flats on the site.

Mr. Walkling reported that the Rural District Council were very interested in acquiring the site for the purpose of erecting old people's flats.

On the proposition of Mr. L. M. Forbes it was unanimously agreed to ascertain the price the Rural District Council were prepared to offer for the site.

Speed Limit - A letter was submitted from the Ministry of Transport indicating that the Minister had considered the Council's objection to the proposal to impose a 30 m.p.h. speed limit on the London-Cambridge-King's Lynn Trunk Road for a distance of 40 yards north-eastwards from Church Lane, but had decided to make the Order without amendment.

855. VILLAGE HALL.

Mr. Forbes reported a probable expenditure of £7,000 for the erection of a new Village Hall. Half this amount would be covered by a grant, one-quarter by voluntary contributions and the remaining quarter by means of a loan.

On the proposition of Mr. L. M. Forbes, seconded by Mr. A. W. Wenham, it was unanimously resolved to borrow the sum of £1,750, being one-quarter the cost of the Village Hall, at the most advantageous rate possible.

It was also agreed on the proposition of Mr. S. A. Siggs, seconded by Mr. A. W. Wenham, that Mr. D. C. Denton Smith of Messrs. Denton Smith and Partners, 40, Regent Street, Cambridge, be appointed Architect for the new Village Hall.

856. DITCH AT REAR OF COLES ROAD.

Mr. Walkling expressed concern at the problem of disposal of surface water resulting from the considerable development which has, and is, being undertaken. In particular he referred to the cleaning of the ditch at the rear of the Coles Road development, and wondered whether the County Council would assume this responsibility when they adopted Coles Road. The Clerk was instructed to ascertain from the County Council whether they were responsible for cleaning the length of ditch in question.

857. <u>LITTER BINS.</u>

The Chairman drew attention to the need for a litter bin at the junction of Fen Road and the haling way.

It was agreed the Clerk purchase a suitable litter bin.

858, BEST KEPT VILLAGE COMPETITION.

In view of the tremendous amount of development taking place it was agreed not to enter the competition this year.
