

Minutes of Joint Meeting between Milton Community Centre Executive Committee and the Parish Council held on Wednesday November 9th 1994 at 8.00pm.

Minute 461/94

1. Minutes of the meeting of June 14th 1994 having been circulated were confirmed and signed.
2. Play Mounds. It was agreed not to pursue the idea of a BMX Track unless a suitable site could be found.
3. Toilets. A letter from the Tennis and Netball clubs expressing concern about difficulty in hiring toilets within the Community Centre was received.  
The Executive Committee had agreed in principle that clubs could use the Community Centre toilets so long as the committee is informed in advance of the date.
4. Access to Coles Road Recreation Ground. Agreed that the gate from Cambridge Road be padlocked - keys to be held by the Manager M.C.C., Mr. Gaskin (owner of land at rear 49 Cambridge Road) and the clerk.
5. Deputy Manager. It was agreed that a means of enabling the Centre to be open for hiring on Sundays was needed. M.C.C. had M.P.C.'s full support to investigate employing a relief manager.  
The Executive Committee would discuss this proposal to put together a job specification to dovetail with the job spec., of the manager.
6. Dog Byelaws. S.C.D.C. were investigating implementing new "poop scoop" dog bye laws on highway verges in place of the present "No Dog Fouling" laws. M.C.C. Executive Committee to discuss at their next meeting whether such bye laws would be effective for the recreation grounds.
7. Bore Holes. M.P.C. to keep M.C.C. informed of negotiations with East Waste Ltd., to dig bore holes adjacent to the 13th Public Drain at The Sycamores Recreation Ground. (To comply with the Environmental Protection Act East Waste must monitor possible seepage from the Landfill Site).  
Any results of samples to be passed on to M.C.C. P.H. to arrange an independent testing of the whole length of the 13th Public Drain.
8. Doctors' Surgery. Planning application had been submitted. A plan of the possible layout of the new car park was discussed. Details of improvements that could be incorporated into the design of the car park to be discussed by the Executive Committee.

Suggestions already made:

- i) Porch over eastern fire exit to make an extra entrance from the new car park.
- ii) Incorporate as many parking places as possible.
- iii) Lockable lean to building at northern end of Community Centre for storage purposes especially for use by the Day Centre.

9. Any Other Business

Outreach Worker. It was noted that the youth worker with the co-operation of the sports clubs was using the sports pavilion on the Sycamores Recreation Ground one night a week as a meeting place with youths.

Maintenance of Play Areas. Copy of R. Adams revised schedule of duties passed to M.C.C.

Next Meeting. It was agreed that the next meeting should involve the full M.C.C. Committee.




The Executive Committee would investigate - the P.C. to be kept informed.

Booking Arrangements. R.J.F. was concerned that the scouts would not be able to use the hall in April 1996. I.D. to raise this issue at Executive Committee.

Sheltered Housing. D.T.W. reported the discussions currently taking place about the possibility of incorporating part of the Coles Road Recreation Ground in a Sheltered Housing scheme.

The clerk to keep M.C.C. informed. Feed back from M.C.C. would be appreciated.
