January 10th 1994 at 7.30pm in the Community Centre.

I. COUNCIL BUSINESS

1. 1/94 Minutes of the meeting of December 6th 1993 having been
circulated were confirmed and signed.

2. Matters Arising

2/94 Structure Plan. Details of the Structure Plan Review Deposit
(117/93) Draft were received. Noted that Council's comments re:
the dualling of the A10 were accepted.

3/94 Telephone Kiosk. J.E.C. had met with B.T. ~~officials~~ *officials and representatives of land bank and County Council and Waterbeach.*
(292/93) ~~officials~~. It was agreed by them that the most suitable place
for kiosk was at the entrance to the landfill site as electricity
was laid on.
The clerk to ask the County Council to install a layby at this
site after closure of the entrance and to ask B.T. to install
a telephone kiosk.

4/94 Land at Willow Crescent. It was noted that the land was deemed
(331/93) to belong to the Crown. The solicitor was contacting the
Treasury Solicitor to find out whether he would be willing
to transfer the land.

5/94 Country Park. Having received a letter from the County
(369/93) Transportation Department Council agreed to leave the Country
Park sign in place at the northern approach to the village.
As S.C.D.C. would allow only one representative on the
management committee R.D. proposed and all agreed that R.T.S.
be the named substitute.

6/94 Coles Road Recreation Ground. D.T.W. signed the amended
(398/93) ~~conveyance~~ *contract.*

7/94 Traffic. Noted that the County Council intended to arrange a
(399/93) pedestrian count in High Street/Cambridge Road.

8/94 Christmas Tree. Agreed to discuss Christmas arrangements 1994
(400/93) at February meeting.

9/94 Police Local Consultation Group. Next meeting 18 January to
(407/93) discuss drugs problem and Parish Special Constable. I.F.M.
unable to attend.

10/94 Dog Signs. I.F.M. proposed R.D. seconded and all agreed to ask
(405/93) S.C.D.C. to put up 20 new signs at £7.11 each. Thanks to
J.E.C. for surveying the village.
H.M.S. to obtain quote for replacing damaged sign at
Froment Way open space.

11/94 Chesterton Fen. It was noted that the County Council were
(406/93) making various improvements to lighting, footpaths and drainage.
Thanks to J.E.C. for persevering with this project.

- 12/94 (408/93) Impact. A letter of thanks for the donation to Impact was received. It was hoped that the swimming pool would open by September 1995.
- 13/94 (410/93) Cemetery. A meeting was arranged with Andrew Rackham of the Farm College on February 24th at 1.30pm to discuss the "meadow" idea.
- 14/94 (413/93) Mobile Warden. A job description was circulated. The committee to oversee the project comprised R.D., I.F.M., J.F.C.F., L. Sandford, Mrs. J. Fisher and one co-opted member. The role of the warden would be more of a co-ordinator. Hours of work approximately two per day. R.L.E.W. proposed J.E.C. seconded and all agreed to support the scheme as per the "Job Description" with one slight amendment. Thanks to all involved. J.F.C.F. would now advertise in the Village View and Cambridge News.
- 15/94 (414/93) Finance Committee. Apologies from D.T.W. for meeting of January 24th.
- 16/94 (419/93) T.P.O.'s The clerk to remind Mr. Hellingsworth of Council's request for T.P.O.'s on the trees along Fen Drift (min 244/93).
3. 17/94 Request from Bottisham V.C. I.F.M. proposed J.F.C.F. seconded and all agreed not to make a donation to the Bottisham V.C. swimming pool project.
4. 18/94 (403/93) Doctors' Surgery. D.T.W. reported that a form of funding had been agreed. Five sites were suggested.
 1. Coles Road Recreation Ground.
 2. Sycamores Recreation Ground.
 3. Open Space opposite Shapers.
 4. Farm School.
 5. Junction of Humphries Way and Landbeach Road.A committee of J.F.C.F., C.F.N. and R.L.E.W. was formed to meet with the doctors. The clerk to ask for planning officer's opinion regarding suitability of these sites.
5. 19/94 (402/93) Youth Worker. A report from A. Allen I.V.C. about a detached youth worker in Milton had been circulated. *D.J.L.* D.J.L. proposed R.D. seconded and all agreed to set up a committee of D.J.L., J.E.C. and R.D. to meet with I.V.C. community staff with a view to setting up a pilot scheme during the Summer Term.
6. 20/94 (396/93) Local Government Review. Further details from S.C.D.C. and the County Council were received. It was agreed to discuss at the February meeting.

7. 21/94 Meeting with M.C.C.
 (409/93) BMX Track. It was agreed that the open space opposite Shapers was not suitable for a BMX track. Agreed to discuss at ~~February~~ ^{next joint} meeting.

Path. H.M.S. to draw up plans of a path on to The Sycamores Recreation Ground and to obtain quotes for laying the path.

8. 22/94 Bus Stops. Revised quotations were received. R.L.E.W. proposed I.F.M. seconded and all agreed to accept the lowest quote (i.e. City Services) providing there were no public utilities.

Queensbury were ready to install the shelters. R.T.S. proposed D.J.L. seconded and all agreed to have two shelters erected near Tesco. Third one to be erected as soon as layby is completed. Agreed to ask J.J. Hall to lay slabs at shelter on verge opposite Tesco.

R.R. had been investigating lighting of the two existing bus shelters (284/93). He had reviewed the lighting arrangements. Negotiations were in hand with Eastern Electricity to reconnect electricity. A quotation for installing the lights was received from Branford Electrical Services.
