

Minutes of a Joint Meeting on Wednesday 14 April 1993 with
Milton Parish Council and Milton Community Centre Executive Committee.

Minute 144/93

1. Minutes of 16 September 1992 were agreed as a true record.

2. Matters Arising

Play Areas. M.C.C. had inspected areas. The manager to rake bark when necessary. Maintenance of equipment now the responsibility of M.C.C.

Trust Deed. Now in the hands of the solicitor.

Lines of Communication. Working well - A.J.C. having been co-opted to M.C.C. Executive Committee.

3. Funding to M.C.C. The suggestions put forward by M.P.C. Finance Committee (minute 36/93) caused considerable discussion. It was proposed R.L.E.W. and agreed to preserve the status quo viz. M.P.C. to fund manager's salary (through payments of bills if necessary). M.C.C. to report each year to M.P.C. giving recommendations as to whether there should be an increase in salary together with supporting evidence.

The clerk to request M.C.C.'s recommendations each year in writing.

J.E.C. proposed and all agreed that any future interviewing panel should be represented by both M.P.C. and M.C.C.

4. B.M.X. Track. M.P.C. Play Committee envisaged a BMX track consisting of a few mounds of soil. M.C.C. were concerned about possible misuse e.g. motorcycles.

M.C.C. agreed to identify sites and report back to the clerk. M.P.C. Play Committee would then draw up designs. Maintenance of track to be responsibility of M.P.C.

5. Sports Pavilion. A design fault had been discovered with the floors in the shower areas. E. Gifford (builder) had agreed to rectify this problem.

M.C.C. had agreed to alter the position of some shower heads and to fit perspex screens to prevent water running into changing rooms. Although this was not a design fault M.C.C. felt that such problems might have been foreseen at the design stage and were therefore requesting help towards payment of the screens. This was considered essential work. Cost of perspex screens £775.

Agreed to meet again in October.
