Numbering and Naming of Streets - Confirmation was received from the Rural District Council that a nameplate would be provided for the Landbeach Road; and that High Street ended at the junction of the Landbeach and Waterbeach Roads.

The Green - The Clerk reported that following an interview Mr. John Wilson, who was acting for the owner, had agreed to pay for the cutting of the weeds if arrangements could be made for this to be done.
