MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES.

Re-Siting of War Memorial - The Clerk reported that the Chairman, Mr. J. S. Doggett and himself had met a representative from the County Surveyor's Department and 831. also a representative of Messrs. Gray Conoley & Company on 14th December and had agreed the site for the War Memorial on the plot of land at the corner of Coles Road and adjacent to the Post Office.

> Post Office Telephones - Wayleave - The Clerk reported that he had negotiated a wayleave rent of 1/- per annum in respect of the telegraph pole erected against the fence at the rear of the Lock Keeper's house at Baits Bite Lock.

Parish Guides - Mr. Forbes had nothing further to report at the present time.

RECREATION GROUND.

Confirmation had now been received from the County Treasurer that the County Council and the Chesterton Rural District Council had agreed to meet jointly the cost of preparing and seeding the recreation ground and the provision of the fencing and access estimated at £853. 3s. 6d.

It was agreed that the Clerk should obtain estimates from Eastern Electricity Board and Eastern Gas Board for laying on supplies to the ground in anticipation of the erection of a new village hall.

VILLAGE HALL.

The Clerk reported a letter dated 1st January, 1964, from the Clerk of Chesterton Rural District Council confirming that the Council were prepared to grant a 99 year lease of a small area of land on the Recreation Ground for the rection of a Village Hall, at a nominal rental. It was unanimously agreed that a rent of £1 per annum be offered for this concession.

Mr. Forbes submitted draft plans of a Colt type building which the Recreation Ground and Village Hall Committee were considering. An architect had been consulted and he was now going into the question of costs and it was hoped to have these finalised in time for the next Council meeting.

The draft plans included accommodation which would be suitable for the Infant Welfare Clinic.
