## MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES.

Ditch at Rear of Coles Road - Information was received from the County Surveyor that the separate highway drains incorporated in the estate roadworks had been carefully designed and discharged into an existing piped drain at the junction of Coles Road and Fen Road. Insofar as land drainage proper was concerned this was not the responsibility of the Highway Authority.

After a full discussion it was agreed the Clerk should seek information from the County Land Agent.

# VILLAGE HALL SITE.

Mr. Walkling reported that Chesterton Rural District Council had applied for planning permission to erect flats on the Village Hall site, but that their application had been refused.

It was agreed the matter be deferred.

#### DEVELOPMENT AT WILLOW HOUSE SITE.

It was anticipated that the development at Willow House would be connected with the estate road serving the development on the Old Post Office site, and it was agreed to recommend to the Rural District Council that the name "Willow Crescent" be adopted for the two estates.

#### WAR MEMORIAL.

A suggested layout for the paved surround had been received from the County Surveyor's Department. This was agreed subject to a double row of slabs being laid round three sides of the War Memorial, leaving the pathway 12 feet wide as shown on the sketch.

The Clerk was instructed to obtain an estimate for two seats to be rected on the War Memorial site.

#### FARM SCHOOL, MILTON.

The County Planning Department asked for observations on a proposal to erect a Farm School to provide accommodation for about 200 agricultural students who would be released from their employment to attend part-time and

evening courses, but not more than 40 students would attend any session. The school would provide facilities for young agricultural employees similar to those offered in the Technical College for young industrial workers, and would consist of a workshop, classroom, laboratory, demonstration room, canteen, library and administration offices, in addition to a glasshouse and implements shed. The site suggested for this development was Manor Farm comprising 55 acres forming part of the County Council Smallholding Estate. It was hoped the school would be built in the financial year 1965/66.

The proposed development met with the Council's wholehearted approval.

CAMBS. PARISH COUNCILS' ASSOCIATION ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

It was agreed the following Resolution apropos the responsibility for cleansing drains on sites which have been developed, should be submitted for consideration at the Annual Meeting of the Parish Councils' Association:-

"When new land is developed can adequate measures be taken to ensure that drainage responsibilities are firmly allocated".

- 872. (b) Name Plates for new Estate. The Clerk was instructed to enquire from Messrs. Gray, Conoley & Co. Ltd. whether name plates could now be erected on their Coles Road Estate.
- 873. (c) Extra Bus Service It was considered there was not sufficient justification in applying for an extra bus service from Cambridge to Milton at 4 o'clock in order to avoid the rush of school children.
  - (d) Refuse Collection In view of the number of flats erected in the village and the high density of development it was agreed to apply to the Rural District ouncil for a weekly collection of refuse.

Mr. Walkling proposed that the appreciation of Mr. Siggs' valuable services to the Council over the past fifteen years be recorded in the Minutes. This expression of appreciation was heartily endorsed.
