DEFINITIVE MAP - PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND BRIDLEWAYS.

The Chairman explained that the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, required that the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Footpaths and Bridleways prepared by the County Council in October 1952, shall be reviewed every five years, and that a Parish Meeting shall be held to consider the information relating to the review of the map.

The Public Rights of Way as shown on the Definitive Map are as follows:-

No. 1 F.P. Towing Path or Haling Way.

Starts at the Cambridge City boundary at the Long Reach; proceeds along the bank of the River Cam as a gravel path beyond Chesterton Fen to timber posts near Baitsbite Locks; continues beyond the Locks and the end of Fen Road to its exit at the Waterbeach Parish boundary.

No. 2 F.P. Baitsbite Locks - To Horningsea.

Starts at No. 1 F.P. (Haling Way) at Baitsbite Lock and proceeds over timber footbridge (in good condition) over the lock; bears right as a gravel path to concrete footbridge over the sluice gates and its exit at the Fen Ditton boundary.

No. 3 C.R.B. Beach Way ore Mere Way (Roman Road).

Starts at the Landbeach Parish boundary; proceeds as a grass road 40 ft. wide (20 ft. of its width is in Milton, the remaining 20 ft. is in Landbeach and Impington) to Butt Lane; continues along the route of the old Roman Road following the parish boundary to its exit at the Impington Parish boundary at the north end of King's Hedges Road.

No. 4 C.R.B. King's Hedges Road.

Starts at the Mere Way and proceeds as a grass road 30 ft. wide (15 ft. of its width only is in Milton, the remaining 15 ft. is in Impington) to its exit at the end of the metalled road near King's Hedges Farm.

No. 5 C.R.F. Grassy Corner.

Starts at Grassy Corner at the Towing Path at concrete posts; proceeds as a grass lane 20 ft. wide to its exit at Chesterton Fen Road.

It was confirmed that the Definitive Map correctly interpreted all recognised public footpaths and bridleways in the village and that there were no amendments thereto.

Accordingly, the Clerk was instructed to convey this information to the Cambridgeshire County Council.

This concluded the business and the Chairman declared the meeting closed.
