MINUTES OF A MEETING OF MILTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN THE  
 VILLAGE HALL ON FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 20th. 1970, 7.30p.m.

Present: Mr.D.Pearson, Chairman, in the Chair; Mrs M.Jones,  
 Messrs L.M.Forbes, P.Kiddle, J.W.R.Lewis, M.J.D.Nurse and  
 R.T.Summerfield, together with the Clerk.

MINUTES

The circulated minutes of the meeting of Sept. 18th.,  
 Sept. 28th., and Oct. 3rd., were confirmed by the meeting  
 and signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES.

1754

Tree-planting scheme (1715,1750,1753) - A reply had now  
 been received from Initial Services (1715) to the Council's  
 letter of 12th., September pointing out that they already  
 assist as ratepayers but should there be a voluntary coll-  
 ection in the village they would wish to be associated.

The Clerk had forwarded an order for 20 trees arising out  
 of the Council's tour of the village (1753) to the County  
 Forestry Officer and awaited acknowledgement.

The Council decided it would not be advisable, at present,  
 to approach Messrs Kaye (1753) with offer of trees for their  
 vacant factory plot.

1755

Screen of trees, Winship Estate (1716) - The Clerk said he  
 had heard from Mr. Gray on 2nd., October acknowledging the  
 Clerk's letter of 25th., August. Mr. Gray hoped to reply  
 in detail and this was now awaited.

1756

Landscaping and tree-planting by developers (1717)- Although  
 the Clerk had sent reminder to the Planning Office on Sept.  
 21st., asking for a reply to his letter of August 25th., no  
 reply had been received.

1757

Village Seats (1720) - The Clerk reported that Mr. D. Haird had completed replacement of the Bene't Close 'bus shelter seat. It appeared to be substantially done in brick with hardboard top.

1758

Parish Insurances (1722) - The Clerk reported he had been notified by Messrs Morice, Tozer, Beck & Oversby Ltd., of the necessary endorsements on the Management Committee's Public Liability Policy and confirmation of £100,000 cover.

Similarly, the Liverpool London & Globe Insurance Co., had sent endorsement of the Council's Public Liability Policy increasing cover to £100,000 at a premium of £2.

1759

Fencing of Recreation Ground (1723) - The Clerk reported on correspondence & telephone conversations with the R.D.C. There had been confusion of the western and northern boundaries and they now agreed on their liability for the western boundary (bordering the Council gardens) and confirmed they would contribute 50% of the cost of fencing the northern boundary.

They further suggested a site meeting with a representative of the County Medical Officer's Department, of the Parish Council, and of the Committee of Management and themselves at an early date. The Council endorsed this and instructed the Clerk to arrange and attend a meeting.

1760

Housing Development, Fen Rd./Old School Lane (C/70/412), (1726) - The Clerk said he had written letters to the Chairmen of the County Council, County Planning Committee and Planning Officers; Mr. Mellor and Mr. Hardy, thanking them for respecting the Parish Council's views on this development.

1761

Waste Land, Coles Road - Messrs Gray, Conoley, in liq. (1730) - The Clerk still awaited decision from Messrs Cooper Bros. in reply to his letter of 16th., July and subsequent reminders.

1762

Goding Way nameplate (1748) - Mrs Jones reported that this nameplate had now been replaced.

MATTERS ARISING FROM EARLIER MINUTES.

1763

Joint meetings of the Parish Council & Village Hall Comm. - The Clerk reminded the meeting that at an earlier Joint Meeting the Committee had asked for such meetings to be held occasionally.

The Council agreed that such meetings could be useful & it was proposed by Mr. Nurse, seconded by Mr. Forbes, that a Joint Meeting be an annual event near the beginning of the year.

They also agreed to invite the Committee to meet the Council on February 2nd., 1971.

1764

CO-OPTION OF A MEMBER IN THE ROOM OF MR. J.S. DOGGETT

After discussing various suggestions the Council agreed to leave the naming of a new member until the next meeting

1765

APPOINTMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TO MILTON PAROCHIAL CHARITIES IN THE ROOM OF MR. J.S. DOGGETT

Proposed by Mr. Forbes, seconded by Mr. Summerfield that Mr. J.W.R. Lewis be nominated to which the Council agreed.

1766

APPOINTMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TO MILTON OVER-60's CLUB

Proposed by Mr. Forbes, seconded by Mr. Summerfield that Mr. A.W. Wenham, be nominated to which the Council agreed.

1767

OLD SCHOOL LANE/FEN ROAD FOOTPATH (1729)

The Clerk reviewed this matter from the correspondence which had now been going on some 2 years and culminated recently in a site meeting of representatives of the County Council Legal and Highways Depts; the 3 residents affected, and the Parish Council Clerk, at which the Highways Dept. had asked the Parish Council to consider agreeing to the closure of the path in view of a likely alternative pathway to the Fen rd. from Old School Lane becoming available on completion of a new housing project.

No agreement could be reached on the defining of the access to Old School Lane or on the question of the path crossing land to which the owner of no. 43a Old School Lane laid claim.

After discussion in which opposing views as to the need for the path were put it was agreed that the Council tell the County Council they would like the path left open until a new footpath (if any) was established, when they would review the situation.

1768

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING, MARCH, 1971.

The Council discussed publicity of the Annual Parish Meeting arising out of a poor attendance in 1970.

They decided that no special arrangements be made provided posters and agenda were adequately displayed.

1769

MONEY RECEIVED.

The sum of £34 had been received from the Treasurer of the Village Hall Committee as their share of the fencing of the eastern boundary of the Recreation Ground to be constructed by the R.D.C. (Parish Council Minute no. 1708). This sum had been deposited in Lloyds Bank.

1770

1776 Development by Messrs Stokes: C/70/694 - arising out of discussion of this in Min. 1771, the Chairman thought that trees should be planted on this development now and Mr. Kiddle thought the Council should take an active interest in the development of the whole of this site by asking the Planning Office to consult in detail; he thought an attractive line of Willows which divided this and the adjoining industrial estate should be preserved if possible.

Mr. Nurse suggested that the industrial road to this site (i.e. between Initial Services and Messrs Kaye) should be joined with the adjoining industrial road at their eastern ends and a one-way traffic system introduced.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

1778 Preservation of trees in the Village - Mr. Lewis thought that advantage should be taken of the service available from the County Council for a tree survey in villages to schedule those of great beauty or rarity for preservation under the Civic Amenities Act.

On Mr. Lewis's proposal, seconded by Mr. Nurse, the Clerk was instructed to invite the Forestry Officer to review trees in Milton.

1779 Dangerous junction of Church Lane & Fen Rd. - The Council agreed with Mr. Lewis's suggestion that the County Council be asked to provide give-way lines at this junction to reduce the danger and give priority to Fen Rd. traffic.

1780

State of pavement between 57 & 81 Cambridge Rd. - The Council agreed with Mr. Nurse's suggestion that complaint be made to the County Council about the very bad state of the pavement here where large puddles form in wet weather.

1781

State of footpath outside the School - They also agreed with Mr. Kiddle that complaint be made about this footpath.

1782

State of Fen Rd. near Shirley Lodge - They also agreed that complaint about the bad state of the road here in wet weather be again brought to the notice of the County Council.

This completed the business and the Chairman closed the meeting.
