## MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES.

957. <u>Ditch at Rear of Coles Road</u> - Information was still awaited from Chesterton Rural District Council as to who was responsible for cleaning this ditch. In the meantime the Clerk was instructed to obtain a legal ruling from the Parish Councils' Association.

<u>Sale of Village Hall Site</u> - The hairman agreed to approach Mr. A. E. Harris to ascertain if he still wished to exercise the option to purchase.

The Clerk was instructed to ask the District Valuer to revelue the site as the three months! validity of his report had expired.

<u>Parish Guide</u> - Copies were now available and distribution was being arranged through the Cubs and Guides packs.

<u>Village Hall Caretaker</u> - The Clerk reported that Mr. G. Johnson had declined to accept the duties of Village Hall and War Memoraal Caretaker; these duties had now been taken over temporarily by Mr. John Day.

### 961. REVIEW OF THE COUNTY DEVELOPMENT PLAN.

Consideration was given to draft proposals for the review of the Town Map as they affected the village. Since the last review of the Town Map the changes proposed were

- (i) the inclusion of a former area of "white land" to the south of Fen Road (O.S. Nos. Pt.124, 124a and 126) within the area zoned for residential purposes,
- (ii) the extension of the Green Belt area to cover the rough land north of the old gravel pits (Pt. O.S. 149, 138 and 137),

- (iii) the establishment of a farm school on the Manor Farm land to the north of the village,
- (iv) the alteration of the notation on the worked out gravel pits in the south to show an area for recreation,
- (v) private household population figures amended from 1,300 in 1963 to 2,010 in 1981.
