Apology for Absence

An apology for absence was received from Mr. A. Wayman.

Minutes

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 30th November 1954, were confirmed and signed.

Matters arising from Minutes

101. Third Party Insurance. The Clerk submitted a quotation from the Liverpool and London and Globe Insurance Company Limited for a £50,000 Indemnity at an annual premium of £1. 0. 0. and was instructed to take out a policy in the amount stated.

102. Bus Shelter - Lighting. The Clerk reported on the interview he had with Colonel Knights, Sub-Area Manager of the Eastern Electricity Board, when the Board had agreed to instal a light in the bus shelter near the Men's Institute, provided a connection could be made to the Institute circuit. The permission had been obtained and accordingly the light would be installed in the very near future. The Clerk was instructed to agree with the Men's Institute for payment of current consumed.

103. Precept 1955/56
The Chairman's action in issuing a precept on Chesterton Rural District Council in an amount of £40 was confirmed; this was equivalent to a fourpenny rate.

105. Coronation Celebrations

The Clerk reported that at the request of the Chester-
ton Rural District Council he had forwarded an unpaid
account in respect of materials supplied for the bus
shelters in support of the Parish Council's Claim for a
grant. The Chairman reported that a grant of £10 would
be forthcoming in the near future.

It was agreed that the Clerk arrange for the transfer
of the balance of monies standing to the credit of the
Coronation Celebrations Fund to the Parish Council's Post
Office Savings Account.

106. Allotments - Waterbeach Road.

The Clerk reported he had communicated with the County
Surveyor following a complaint from an allotment tenant
that bushes growing on the roadside caused an obstruction
of vision. The County Surveyor had replied that the
bushes had now been cut, but Mr. J. Bradnam submitted that
the bushes which caused most obstruction were some black-
berry brambles which had not been cut. The Clerk was in-
structed to ask that these also be cut.

107. Litter Baskets

Mrs. D. Pearson raised the question of litter baskets
being provided at the bus shelters. The Clerk was instruc-
ted to enquire whether the County Council would provide
them.

Mr. Siggs agreed to make enquiries as to cost of
