The Clerk reported the receipt of a letter from the Electricity Service Manager of the Eastern Electricity Board, Fens Sub Area, indicating the Annual Charge for Energy in respect of the light in the bus shelter as £2. 7. Od. This matter had been taken up with the Fens Sub Area Manager, who had previously quoted an annual charge of approximately 10/- and the Clerk was instructed to pursue the matter.

Mr. Siggs submitted prices of commemoration placques and also of notices concerning litter in the bus shelters and it was agreed that two placques and two litter notices be purchased for display in the bus shelters

The Clerk reported that the County Council had referred this matter to the Chesterton Rural District Council as Sanitary Authority.

## 112. Landbeach Road Cemetery

The Reverend J. M. Plumley explained that the Parochial Church Council were responsible for the maintenance of the cemetery in so far as paths and hedges were concerned. In the past the Church Council had organised

working parties from their numbers who had tidied up both the churchyard and the cemetery, but as every parishioner had an equal right of access to the cemetery any offers of help from parishioners would be most gratefully accepted. Members of the Parish Council agreed to co-operate in the task of keeping the cemetery tidy.
