War Memorial. 1093.

> The Chairman welcomed Mr. Moule and Mr. Birchenall, representatives of the British Legion, who had been invited to attend in order to discuss the future maintenance of the War Memorial site. Mr. Moule stated that the British Legion had received numerous complaints of children playing on and around the memorial and this, together with the untidy grassed area, compalled them to suggest that the only remedy seemed to be to erect a chain and post fence round the Memorial and to have flower beds in the grassed area. Members of the British Legion would be prepared to tend the flower beds. Mr. Birchenall supported this suggestion.

Having heard the views of the British Legion, Mr. Walkling suggested the matter now be left to the Parish Council to deal with and this was agreed. The Chairman thanked Mr. Moule and Mr. Birchenall for their helpful comments.

1094. Bús Service.

> The Chesterton Rural District Council asked for comments on the Eastern Counties Omnibus Company's proposals to withdraw certain services between Waterbeach and Cambridge on Mondayssto Fridays, and to increase the number of services available on Thursdays. No objection was raised to these proposals.

It was agreed to recommend that the journey at 22.35 hours Cambridge to Ely on weekdays be retarded to 22.45 hours in order to cater for cinemagoers.

Greenacres Estate, Milton.

A letter was received from Messrs. Crossman & Company, who were acting for Torrester Properties Limited, the developers of the Greenacres Estate, stating they understood the Parish Council was responsible for maintaining the open spaces which had been left as a condition of planning permission.
