### MINUTES.

The Minutes of the meeting held on 25th September, 1962, were read, confirmed by the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

## MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES.

Signposting to Milton Fen and Baitsbite Locks - The diversion of the A.10 trunk road had just been authorised by the Ministry of Transport and the County Surveyor promised that the request for improved signposting would be borne in mind when the new signs were designed.

## VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT.

In view of the urgency and importance of this matter the Chairman explained that he had advanced the date of the meeting in order to comply with the wishes of the County Planning Officer, who was seeking information as a result of the following Resolution moved and adopted at a meeting of the County Council -

"That owing to the number of complaints regarding the standard of development and design which is taking place in many Cambridgeshire villages, the Planning Committee submit to the next meeting of the Council a report as to what is required to improve location, design and layout of future development."

After careful consideration it was agreed the following comments be submitted to the questions posed -

(a) Which new developments are considered to be out of keeping with the character and appearance of the village?

Comment: The general opinion is that none of the new development is out of keeping with the general character and appearance of the village.

(b) Which new developments are are looked upon as satisfactory and possibly an improvement to the village scene?

Comment: The estate at Goding Way, Fen Road, and Lyndhurst Close, Butt Lane, were favourably commented upon, and thought to enhance the appearance of the village.

(c) Where there is concern about the standard of design and appearance, is this more applicable to estates than to individual dwellings?

Comment: Concern was expressed as to the standard of design of the new estate (Gray, Conolly & Co.) at Coles Road, Old School Lane and Pryor Close, but generally speaking it was felt that this type of dwelling did meet the requirements of a certain section of the public and came within the price limits which they could afford.

(d) Is there any development, either in the form of an estate or individual buildings, which is considered to be wrongly sited in relation to the village as a whole?

Comment: It was felt the new school was definitely wrongly sited as the large majority of children had to cross the main A.10 trunk road.

(e) Are there any detailed aspects of the layout design which call for special comment, such as the use of brick walls rather than hedges as boundary fences?

Comment: It was felt the open plan layout of gardens in Coles Road Estate and Church Lane, was very successful and pleasant. The use of hedges as opposed to walls for boundary fences was definitely advocated.

(f) Has concern been expressed about the way in which new development has required the felling of existing trees and what importance does the Parish Council attach to the retention of existing trees as far as possible and additional planting of new estates?

Comment: The development to date has not necessitated the felling of existing trees, but it is essential that in any future development existing trees are maintained, if at all possible, and where applicable additional planting should be undertaken.
