1967 AT 7.30 p.m.

There were present: Mr.D.Pearson, in the chair, I.Pearson, Messrs J.S.Doggett, L.M.Forbes, J.W.R.Lewis, E.J. Walkling and A.W.Wenham, together with the Clerk.

MINUTES. (1287). 1219

> Draft copies of the Minutes of the previous meeting had been/circulated according to repolution at that meeting. Having been amended by the addition of one item inadvertently omitted by the Clerk they were accepted, confirmed by the meeting and signed by the Chaitman.

# MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES.

Waste Land. Coles Road (1168). The Clerk read a letter from 1220 Messrs Thedore Goddard & Co, acting for Messrs Gray, Connolly, saying that Messrs Gray, Connolly would, "in certain circumstances" be prepared to offer an area of land to the Council for recreational purposes but that they also wished to develop an adjoining piece.

> The Clerk was instructed to reply that the Council would be pleased to have such a gift for Milton Village and wished for full clarification of the circumstances regarding th piece to be developed.

War Memorial (1162) - The Clerk read a reply from Mr. Eddy Weatherill (of Barton) that he may be able to fit in the cutting of the War Memorial grass when doing the nearby flats when he resumed in April and would contact the Clerk on or before this time.

The Clerk was given instructions to act in this matter in consultation with the Chairman.

Old School and Schoolhouse (1164) - The Clerk had received copies of further correspondence, by courtesy of the Bursar of King's College, between himself and the Rev. Franklin, Rector of Milton, and between himself and Messrs Carter Jonas. The Bursar had instructed the latter to apply for Planning permission for change of use to residential development with a view to selling by auction, and to the Rev. Franklin had further tried to make it quite clear that, unfortunately, under the Education Act, there was no prospect of any of the proceeds of sale benefit ing Milton Church, but King's College would do their best to get the money used for education purposes within the parish. Landbeach Road Cemetery (1193) - The Parochial Church Council had written thanking the Council for their 'gen-

erous offer' of an annual grant towards cost of renovation. They also said they believed the responsibility of this Cemetery was not wholly theirs and were trying to find a workable solution.

The Parish Council felt some concern that no more definite indication of action appeared to be forthcoming. After discussion Mr. L.M. Forbes proposed, and Mr. A.W. Wenham seconded that, as a gesture, the Parish Council offer the Church Council help with hedge-cutting on this occasion without prejudice to future care of the hedges or to their offer already accepted by the Church Council.

Aqueduct -River Cam (1195) - Reply had been received from the Engineer to the Conservators that they would remove the 1224 old timber aueduct and it was unlikely there would be any charge to the Council. Commons Registration Act (1202) - The Clerk reported that 1225 he had written to the County Planning Office informing them that, as far as the Council knew, there was now no Common land in Milton. A copy of the 'Commons Registration (General) Regulations, 1966' had been received from the Ministry of Land and Natural Resources. 'Bus Shelter Lights, Maintenance (1210) - The Clerk reported he had written to the Eastern Electricity Board for 1226 details of their maintenance servaces and charges in respect of these two lights and was awaiting reply. State of the Fen Road (1210A) - Apersonal reply had been received from Mr.J.B.Dickerson of Messrs Dickersons apol-1227 ogising for the deposition of mud in Fen Road of which the Council had complained. He gave a firm promise not to cause further inconvenience. They had used 500 gallons of water to clean the road and were trying to get their own road-sweeper. Their policy now was to use City tips in winter and Milton tips in summernonly when conditions were better. The Glerk was instructed to thank Mesrs Dickerson Toilets on Recreation Ground (1194) - The Clerk of the R.D.C. had informed the Council that their public health 1228 Committee had agreed, on January 10th, to recommend to the R.D.C. that a joint drain be provided to serve the proposed village hall at the proposed public convenience the cost to be shared equally between the R.D.C. and the Village Hall Committee. Coles Road/Recreation Ground Ditch (1200) - The Secretary 1229 of the Village Hall Committee had written asking if the Council would establish theresponsibility for this ditch before October, 1966. The Council thought this was unnecessary, they having, as riparian occupier of the land (namely: the Recreation Ground) which the ditch bounded, accepted responsibility and theynfelt the Management Committee should now discharge this duty. The Clerk was instructed to make it quite clear that they were not so much concerned about deep-eleansing as the removal of, or better still, preventing deposition of rubbish, tins, old iron etc. liable to impede the flow. NEW VILLAGE HALL 1230 (a) Council accomodation - The Chairman enquired of Mr.L. M. Forbes (Chairman of the Village Hall Committee) what sepepate accommodation there was in the plans for Parish Council or small Committee meetings. Mr. Forbes replied that, for economy reasons, such seperate accomodation had been deleted but there was to be a seperate kitchen. The Clerk was instructed to make the Council's view known to the Committee and to enquire also about adequate and

comfortable furnishings for Council and committee meetimgs.

(b) Funds for erection - The Secretary of the Village Hall Committee had 'taken the opportunity of informing the Council' that the Committee had received approval of the grant of £3,400 from the Department of Education and Science payable on completion of the building which he hoped would be 'around June'. He now hoped the Council would treat the sale of the old Village Hall site as a matter of urgency as various payments would be required during building.

The Clerk was directed to reply that negotiations were being re-opened and concrete arrangements would be made as soon as possible. He was also directed to inquire of the Aston Building Co if their previous offer still stood firm.

### OFFICE EQUIPMENT.

Mr. Walkling raised the question of equipment for the Clerk and it was agreed that certain articles were essemtial. Mr. Walkling proposed and Mr. Doggett seconded, that the Clerk be empowered to incur expenditure of up to £100 on such equipment importance being given to a Typewriter and a Duplicating Machine and also a filing or storage Cabinet for documents of which the Council now had a considerable number.

RATE PRECEPT. 1967/8 - The Clerk submitted rough financial estimates, including likely expenditure in 1967/8; the product of a penny rate for the forthcoming year was estimated at £245. Fr m the ensuing discussion it emerged that with the building of the new village hall the year's expenses would be high.

Mr.L.M.Forbes proposed and Mr. A.W.Wenham seconded that year, the Council precept for a 4d rate with the hopes of reducing this in future years. This was agreed.
