Banker's Ditch - The Clerk reported that he had had an interview with a member of Chesterton Rural District Council Engineering Department who had emphatically denied that the Rural District Council's workmen had been responsible for demolishing the sluice at the Baitsbite Lock end of Banker's Ditch. It was therefore agreed that Messrs. D. Pearson, S. A. Siggs and A. Wayman inspect the sluice with a view to ascertaining whether it serves a useful purpose and report at the next meeting.

321. Litter Bins - The Clerk reported that he had contacted the Clerk to the Rural District Council and in accordance with the advice he gave it was agreed to purchase two litter bins as equipment for the two bus shelters.

Insurance of Clerks Against Personal Accidents.

From additional information submitted it was evident that where a Clerk of a Parish Council was already covered by national insurance by reason of full-time employment elsewhere, then he was not compulsorily insurable by a Parish Council.

Eastern Counties Omnibus Company - The Clerk reported that an inspector from the bus company had attended at Milton and had reported that there was no evidence of any inadequacy of buses. The inspector would be attending again on a Saturday afternoon to make quite sure that the service provided was adequate.

Third Party Insurance Policy - The Clerk had confirmed with the Insurance Company that this policy covered the legal liability of the Council to members of the public, including liability arising out of ownership of the following property -
