Minutes of a Special Meeting of Milton Parish Council held on 26 April 1983 in the Village Hall following the A.P.M.

1. 5544 ICFC Properties Ltd - Science Park. Dr. Bradfield, Bursar of Trinity and Mr. J. Tweddle of Messrs. Bidwells had visited the chairman and clerk the previous week to explain the position of ICFC at the Science Park. As a result this meeting was called to see if the Parish Council could now waive its objection thus allowing Mr. Sillery of S.C.D.C. to approve the application using his delegated powers.
- After a long discussion the Council still had doubts about ICFC especially as it was felt that only a very small proportion of the company's time would be spent advising scientific firms at the Science Park.

The Clerk was instructed, therefore, to write to Mr. Sillery explaining that there was no objection to the starter units but that the Council did object to a Finance Company, whose work was not wholly scientific.

It was agreed that this application should be determined by the S.C.D.C. Planning Committee.

2. New Application.

5545 S/0554/83 Trinity College, Social, Recreational and Conference Centre, Science Park - no comments.

5546 Milton Plan - Housing. R.T.S. commented that he understood that 15 acres of the Bene't Farm site had been bought for housing with an option to buy the rest. Concern was expressed both by S.B.P. and R.T.S. about the promised recreation ground and the drainage situation.

K.P.H. had been assured by Mr. Sillery that the recreation ground would be next to the slip road.

It was agreed that nothing could be done until the planning application was received.

B.C.W. thought it advisable to invite Mr. Robert Arnold to a meeting after the deposit period of the Plan.
