MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES.

214. Caravan, Fen Road. The Clerk reported a letter from
the Chesterton Rural District Council to the effect that
the parking of the caravan created no nuisance from the
public health point of view and no action was justified.

215. Allotments. The County Small Holdings Committee were
to review all rents in the near future and at that review
the inconvenience suffered by the tenants by reason of the
electricity poles sited on the land would be taken into
account and the new rent negotiated on that basis.

216. Bus Shelter Lighting. The Clerk reported that the
lighting in the Cambridge Road Bus Shelter commenced on
27th October, 1956.

217. Street Lighting. The Rural District Council intimated
that the two additional lamp columns already delivered
would be erected in the near future.

RECREATION GROUND.

The Chairman reported that the Minister of Housing and Local Government had dismissed the appeal of Mr. A. J. Winship who sought permission to develop part of O.S. No. 149 for the winning of gravel.

The County Planning Department had included O.S. No. 149 in the Town Map No. 2 as a public open space, but the Minister had not as yet given his approval to Town Map No. 2, and as a consequence the time was not opportune for the Council to discuss the question of a Recreation Ground.

On the proposition of Mr. S. A. Siggs, seconded by Mr. D. Pearson, it was resolved that the question of the Recreation Ground be deferred to the next meeting.
