MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES.

Street Lighting - The Clerk reported that the Chesterton Rural District Council had agreed to provide two extra street lights to be erected at Milton Laundry and at the Post Office.

They would not agree to assume responsibility for the payment of the annual charge for the lighting of the bus shelter.

Bus Timetable - The Clerk reported that the Eastern Counties Omnibus Company had now provided and fixed a bus time table in the Cambridge Road bus shelter.

174. Proposed Public Open Space.

The Chairman welcomed Mr. Gimmingham, Deputy County Planning Officer, to the meeting. Mr. Gimmingham explained that the Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation had altered their plans for the re-alignment of

the trunk road, A.10, in so far as they did not now propose to purchase the site of the Men's Institute for this purpose, but instead they planned to build the linking road between the bus shelter and Mr. Holland's cycle shop. This was also indicated on a plan accompanying a letter dated 14th February 1956, from the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, which the Clerk read, and which indicated that the Minister proposed to confirm Milton Parish Council as the purchasing authority for the area of land shown edged red on the plan unless he was notified to the contrary by the 13th March, 1956. This new development was contrary to that outlined at the Public Inquiry held on the 12th January 1956, when the Chairman and Deputy Chairman represented the Council.

The matter was fully discussed and it was thought that the site of the present Men's Institute was adequate for any village hall which might be built in the future, and as a consequence it was not considered necessary to purchase any part of O.S. No. 98 for this purpose. Accordingly, Mr. S. A. Siggs proposed that the decision taken at the meeting held on 30th January 1956, be revoked and the Minister of Housing and Local Government be informed that the Parish Council does not now wish to be named as the purchasing authority for the land comprising part of O.S. No 98 and shown edged red on the plan accompanying the Minister's letter dated 14th February, 1956. This proposition was seconded by Mr. D. Pearson and carried unanimously.

175. PARISH COUNCILS' ASSOCIATION.

- (a) Affiliation Fees A new scale of fees was to be adopted as from 1st April 1956 based on an amount equal to one-eighth of the product of a penny rate as in force on the 29th February 1956, and thereafter that in force on the 29th February in any Leap Year. The fee due for 1956/57 amounted to £1. 6s. 3d.
- (b) Parish Council Review It was reported that the Association would no longer circulate a free copy of the Parish Council Review, and it was agreed to purchase 6 copies at a cost of 1/3d. per copy per quarter.
