PROPOSED PUBLIC OPEN SPACE.

The Chairman reported that at a recent meeting of the
Village Hall Planning and Building Committee a decision
had been taken to recommend the Parish Council to purchase
that portion of O.S.P. 98 not required by the County
Council for the re-alignment of Trunk Road A.10, an area
of .65 acres. After discussion Mr. S. A. Siggs proposed:-

"That this Council is prepared to purchase an
area of .65 acres, being part of O.S.P. 98
at the junction of High Street and Church
Lane, Milton, provided permission is granted
for a village hall to be erected thereon at
some time in the future, and FURTHER that
the purchase price be paid either from money
in hand, or, if necessary, by way of a loan".

This proposition was seconded by Mr. D. Pearson and
carried unanimously.

PRECEPT 1956/1957.

The Clerk presented an estimate of the expenditure
needed for the financial year 1956/57, which amounted to
£37. Os. Od. On the proposition of Mr. S. A. Siggs,
seconded by Mr. A. Wayman, it was resolved to issue a
precept on the Chesterton Rural District Council in an
amount of £44. Os. Od., which is equivalent to a twopenny
rate.

Mr. H. Easy, being allotment rent due at Michaelmas, 1955.


