MINUTES

The circulated minutes of the meeting of September 17th. 1969, were confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

1574

Proposed Toilet & Village Hall Extension (1563) - The Council discussed a request from the Management Committee for a further joint meeting to clarify the financial position of these two proposals.

On the proposition of Mr. L.M. Forbes, seconded by Mr. E.J. Walkling, the Council agreed to this on the condition that the Committee produce evidence to support their contention that an extension is 'economically viable'.

Size of Council (1564) - The Clerk said he would submit the Council's application for an increase of two members for the County Council's December meeting and report at the next Parish Council meeting in January.

Autumn Conference of the Parish Council's Association (1565) - The Clerk submitted a brief report on this meeting about the Maude Report which he had previously circulated. The Council discussed the controversial opinions being held on effective Parish Council representation likely to emerge from the Maud proposals, including notices being circulated by the Chesterton R.D.C. to Parish Councils objecting to the remoteness of representation which they contended would result.

Library Facilities in Milton - The Clerk read a letter from Mrs J. Weston, 17 Knight's Way, asking for the Mobile Library Service to visit Milton to continue the encouragement of children in reading they had already received at school, and also for the convenience of older people unable to go into Cambridge readily.

The Clerk said he had enquired from the County Librarian who regretted that the Mobile Service was already very much overloaded and priority had to be given to more out-lying villages. She said that if a suitable building could be found in the village they would very much like to set up a permanent Branch Library at Milton as had recently been done at Willingham.

The Clerk was instructed to tell Mrs Weston of the position. He was also instructed, on the suggestion of Mr. J. S. Doggett, to ask that Milton be placed on the list for visits from the Mobile service if and when extra Mobile facilities were introduced by the County Library.
