271/89 The application for one illuminated and one (225/89) non illuminated sign for AK20 Intervet Science Park was now withdrawn.

272/89 Hospice. S.C.D.C. were concerned whenever development took place prior to the granting of the consent.

A decision had not been made and any comments made by the Parish Council would be taken into consideration before the final decision.

## 2. New Applications

273/89 5/2621/87 Martin Grant Homes - amendment to plot 60 (229/88) change of house type from Belmont to Buckingham (the original application). Neighbour's (Gunnell Close) objection fully supported by Parish Council. This

house had already been built according to the amended plan prior to permission for the change being granted. The contractors had proceeded with their original plans despite having agreed an earlier amended plan which would not have caused the neighbour as much loss of amenity. The house should be pulled down and replaced with the house in accordance with the approved plan.
