15 members of the public attended to listen to the Fen Road development proposal. Item 5.

5 Kingswater Lindum Ltd – Fen Road Development

Azhar Ahmed of Cross Keys Housing and Ben Richardson of Saunders Boston (Architect) attended the meeting to present the pre-application proposal for the development on Fen Road that was presented to South Cambs Planning Department hearing. Unfortunately an archeologically report was not forthcoming. BR informed MPC that South Cambs reported a need of affordable housing in Milton and have had positive feedback about the development.

The proposed development is for 36 units 100% affordable. 24 units will be affordable rent and 12 shared ownership. The landscaping of the development will be maintained by Cross Keys Holmes and will be an open plan design. The only loss of vegetation will be to clear the way for the new access road. Each property will be allocated car parking spaces with the possibility of an extra 60 cars using Fen Road. The impact and acceptability of extra traffic in Fen Road has been considered at SCDC and Cambs County Highways.

Kingswater Lindum are currently planning to have a public consultation on 26 October 2.30pm to 7pm at the Milton Community Centre for residents to see the plans and voice concerns or suggestions.

AH updated the Committee that BT is our best way forward as we currently hold a phone line with them and our address is recognised. Virgin could not locate the MPC office address so cannot provide broadband to us. AH Proposed that MPC go with BT to provide a better and faster broadband – DO Seconded ALL AGREED.

12 Mobile Speed Sign Update.

The VAT issue regarding the purchase of the speed sign has now been confirmed. Waterbeach will purchase the sign and claim back the VAT and will invoice the other 2 Parishes at net cost without VAT.

To CONSIDER writing a formal approval for purchase letter. MPC has been asked to write a formal confirmation letter to the purchase of the speed sign. AH Proposed – VC Seconded ALL AGREED.

To AGREE to signing the Memorandum of Understanding for Mobile Vehicle Activated Signs and Speed Indicator Devices before the Mobile Vehicle Activated Sign could be used. AB has confirmed an amendment to the MOU in regard to insurance. HMS confirmed that MPC's insurance covers this activity and had had confirmation from the insurance company. AB Proposed to sign the agreement DB Seconded ALL AGREED. JEC to sign as Chairman.

18 MCC Report October 2017

Maintenance/Improvements: The footpath alongside the Bowls Green hedge has been installed.

Bookings: There are two Saturday night booking's during October.

Youth Building: Nothing to report, other than the situation with Edmund Trust using the building on a daily basis is still ongoing.

North Lodge: Colts use the facilities every Saturday and Sunday and the Pavilion is hired occasionally during the week.

Vandalism: Not actually vandalism, but there have been 2 incidents worth mentioning this month: 1) The brick wall surrounding our industrial bins was partially knocked down during the first weekend in September, presumably by a large vehicle. 2) There was an attempted break in between the 16th and 19th September at the garage on the Sycamores Rec and although the perpetrators did not manage to get in, the damage they caused means that a new door is required. The garage contains cricket and football equipment of very little value. Both incidents have been reported to the Police and are now in the hands of our Insurance Company.

19 County Councillors Report - October 2017 Anna Bradnam

Covering the following:

Planning

New northern boundary of the Waterbeach strategic site. If RLW's proposal for 5,000 houses is accepted, the total for the site will amount to 11,500, so 1,500 more than SCDC approved in Autumn 2016.

Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority (and the Mayor)

A key function of the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority is to attract investment into the area and the Mayor is preparing to bid for money from the government's Housing Infrastructure Fund whose purpose is to 'unlock' otherwise difficult sites, where housing is in greatest demand. This £193m funding would enable the relocation of the Anglian Water Cambridge Water Recycling Centre which in turn would free up 40 hectares of land for development for an estimated 7,600 new homes on the land around Cambridge North Station. The Mayor is also proposing to dissolve the County Council.

How much does a Mayor cost?

When the Combined Authority was originally proposed, the costs of the Mayor's office were estimated to be around £800,000 pa, at least initially using officers seconded from the County Council. The actual costs (so far) are £1.8 million and climbing, with more new staff appointments.

Local Governance

The County Council has not only created two new service Committees (Commercial & Investment and Communities & Partnerships) with their attendant scale of remuneration for the Chair and Vice-Chair but in addition, the C&P Committee has created five new roles (attracting additional allowances) with responsibilities to "liaise with the Parish, Town, District/City and County Councillors to understand the needs of local communities at District level." These roles, which cover geographic areas larger than County Divisions will be practically impossible to deliver and will unnecessarily duplicate the roles of existing County and District Councillors.

Children's Centres

The County's consultation on Children's Centres has now closed.

Libraries

The Council is seeking ways of ensuring the Library service can meet the challenges of a growing population, new developments and tight public finances. There will be public consultation in the future on this.

Items to update

RTPI opp. Tesco still chasing as to why it has not been fixed.

AB has asked for a seat to be installed in the new bus shelter to be erected on Ely Road.

There is a joint Parish meeting on Wednesday 11 October at NLP to further discuss the Waterbeach project. Cambs County Council is to spend up to £50k reviewing the bus services.

20 District Councilor's Report - Anna Bradnam October 2017

The following are an extract of topics from the reports provided.

Rubbish

The Council has decided to dispense with paper caddies in the recycling bins. This is partly because the price paid for clean paper has dropped and partly because the 'split-back' lorries in which paper is collected separately, are often empty on the paper side. Equally the paper can be very effectively sorted out of the rest of the recycleables at the Amey plant. Amey propose to build an energy from waste plant at their site in Ely Road and they held some open days for residents at which the process, building and landscaping were explained. The County Council's adopted minerals and waste plan made an allocation for an energy from waste plant at the site. So this sort of development is in accordance with the development plant but any application would be considered afresh at the time of submission.

Milton Air Quality Working Party

The scheduled Liaison meeting with FCC Environment was postponed until March 2018, as FCC have not accepted any new waste onto the site whilst the police investigation has been ongoing. The Anglian Water site still awaits the installation of the new gas holder.

Benefits payments - delayed

AB was advised that due to an administrative error, 1,100 benefits payments from SCDC were not made. Staff worked hard to resolve the problem. They are also reimbursing any bank charges incurred as a result of the error. The teams are apologising unreservedly for the mistake and working to ensure it doesn't happen again.

District Councilor's Report – Hazel Smith October 2017

Bid to move the sewage works

The Combined Authority on Wednesday 27th September is to discuss a bid to the National Infrastructure Fund for £193m which is to help with making development for housing on the Sewage Works site (in the City) and Chesterton Sidings (in Milton), near Cambridge North Station viable. We are told that secret discussions have been going on for a couple of years and they are now ready to bid. The site for the new Works is not mentioned in the document but is now unlikely to be Honey Hill.

Social Isolation report

This is to be presented to Cabinet in November and we hope some of the conclusions may then be implemented. As more of our residents live in their own homes till later in life, keeping people in touch with services and social events near them will become more and more crucial for people's wellbeing.

Amey open day

The display of the plans for Energy from Waste at Amey's plant beyond Waterbeach was very interesting. There is a 'hope' that the heat produced could be used in the houses in Phase 1 of the new development, which is just across the road. Electricity will be fed into the National Grid, but direct use of the heat produced is far more efficient.

Fen Road, Chesterton

HMS has spent some hours recently going door-to-door again with a petition asking Anglian Water to evaluate whether the residents qualify for a sewage connection to the Works just the other side of the railway. HMS last tried this 10 years ago and since the appeal failed has pushed for a change to the guidance or the law via our MP and in the House of Lords: South Cambs now has a new officer in Environmental Health who has promised to help and was encouraged to get a letter from Therese Coffey MP suggesting we should try again (but not promising anything). The decision hinged on the technical point that Caravans are not included in the definition of Buildings for this purpose. The law in Wales has been changed, but DEFRA have been dragging their feet over having a similar review for English cases, which we were promised several times by different ministers.

The other issue on Fen Road is the length of time that the crossing gates are now down, and in the morning, particularly. To get children to school in Nuffield Road parents who drive have to leave at 8:10. The crossing gate is regularly down for 4 trains in a row, 20 minutes, and one lady said on one occasion it was 35 minutes wait (6 trains). Often the barrier is raised and then comes down again before the long queue has all got through. HMS had raised this issue in the consultation on the new station and was told that it would be no worse than before! HMS has have now raised it with Network Rail but there is unlikely to be much they can do unless the Level Crossings Manager can change something in the timings allowed. The walking by-pass that took pedestrians down past the pink bungalow to the towpath is no longer open, so parents have no alternative route.
