Double yellow lines would not help the situation just move the problem further down the road. JEC mentioned that this is an ongoing issue within the village and MPC does discuss this with the Village PCSO but not much can be done.

### 15 Milton Community Centre Update and Report September 2018

Maintenance/Improvements: The fluorescent lights in the Annexe have been replaced with LED's which are safer and should lead to a reduction in our electricity bill. The tyre swing on Coles Road rec has been condemned by Fenland Leisure Products as the wood appeared to be rotten. The swing has been removed to make it safe and the hardstanding will be removed at some point and replaced with top soil.

**Bookings:** All of our groups will start up again during September, apart from the Wednesday baby feeding group, which doesn't have sufficient volunteers.

Youth Building: Eddies Artworks are now well established and all appears to be going well.

**North Lodge:** Colts will start using the Pavilion every weekend from September, there will be both a Wednesday and Thursday morning French class starting during September and Inland Waterways will use the building on average once a month for their evening meetings.

To AGREE to reimburse MCC the cost for insuring the new play equipment of £290 and £320 for the new bin. JEC PROPOSED to reimburse MCC for the extra insurance cost involved and the purchase of a new bin as the previous one could not be reused - 4 in favour, 1 against, 3 abstain - AGREED

Football Pitches – North Lodge – to **CONSIDER** costs of verti draining and re seeding of pitches from North Lodge Budget. JEC informed the Committee that a request had come in for work to be carried out on the football pitches at North Lodge and MCC would wish to use the Parish Council NLP budget of £5k towards this. MPC at year end might be required to refund MCC the overspend. To consider this in March.

RF reported that the burst water main at The Sycamores has now been repaired but Anglia Water still need to clear up the surrounding area. The piece of fitness equipment removed can now be reinstalled by Wicksteed. AH Proposed that Anglia Water pay the invoice for reinstallation – DO Seconded ALL AGREED

### 16 County Councillors Report - September 2018 Anna Bradnam

### Healthwatch: Advocacy for people navigating health services.

**Police:** The way police services are delivered in our villages has changed. In the past Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) were often seen in the villages and the quarterly Neighbourhood Panel public meetings were an opportunity for residents to hear about what was going on and to ask questions directly. This visible presence has gone. We are advised that:

- Police priorities are domestic violence, modern slavery, sexual offences, child sexual exploitation and dwelling burglary. They focus on vulnerability and harm and shutting down criminal gangs.
- South Cambs has a large number of Neighbourhood Watch volunteers 'who want to do more'. It is hoped that 'community resilience' can develop through community groups.
- The Crime and Disorder Partnership is key to district-wide problem-solving and deals with hare-coursing, fly-tipping
  and 'nightmare neighbours'.

Police are working on:

- Better direct liaison with the parishes and councillors.
- A quarterly on-line survey to be introduced via eCops, Twitter, school student mail etc.
- You can report a crime online, at <u>Cambridgeshire Insight</u>, anonymously if you prefer. (click 'Report a Crime' at the top of the page.) Subscribe to eCops via the website.

Roads: There has been a dramatic jump in numbers of pot holes reported and compensation claims made thus far in 2018.

### Buses Services Citi 2, 9/X9, Service 196 (now 19)

AB arranged a meeting with Stagecoach and Cllr Daunton attended – Since 29 July the old 196 route is now being served by a number of different service numbers at different times of day. AB thanked Stagecoach for providing a bus service when Whippet pulled out at very short notice. We accepted that some confusion was to be expected in the first days of the new service but they acknowledged the inconvenience and distress this had caused passengers.

- It was agreed that Stagecoach would provide <u>a new combined timetable</u> that will include all the services covering the route <u>and a map</u>, so it is clear to passengers where the bus is going. These will be posted at all bus stops asap. The timetable will show the Stand Number for the return journey from Cambridge, to help plan the return journey.
- The Cambridge and Peterborough Combined Authority issue contracts for these services now (not the County Council) and they have only issued a contract until the end of March 2019.
- We emphasised that although only one or two people might get on the bus at any particular stop, or get off there in the
  evening for those people, the bus is vital, to get to work or to appointments, or to school. So arguments about
  viability need to be balanced with the need to maintain a reliable public service.

### 17 Joint District Councilor's Report - September 2018

### Covering the following: Judith Rippeth

**New Town:** JR has received an email from the office of the Police and Crime Commissioner in response to policing Waterbeach in the future with a potential 30 000 new residents in the new town. One PCSO covering Milton and Waterbeach wouldn't be enough. There was an understanding that resources would need to be increased apart from the proposal of a part-time office to report crime or seek help, in the community hub of the new town.

**Training:** JR has participated in a programme of new member training events made up of a mix of briefings and workshops on topics as diverse as Environmental Health, Chairing Skills and Safeguarding. JR also attended a day course in Chelmsford on 'Achieving Well Designed Places'.

### Covering the following: Hazel Smith

Bus improvement group: HMS attended a meeting at Clay Farm where the Greater Cambridge Partnership's transport officer Peter Blake gave a presentation of his view on the way forward.

Waterbeach planning: All 3 local councillors met with RLW, the Developers, to go through their ideas in July. Housing tenants: HMS attended her first Tenant Participation Group meeting at Denson Close, Waterbeach: The annual Best Kept Garden competition prize giving is coming up.

New Housing developments: HMS went with one of the housing development officers on the ACRE tour of exception sites in East Cambs, South Cambs and Hunts areas.

**Travellers**: Having responded to the consultation on stronger powers for the police to move Travellers on, HMS went with 3 officers to a Westminster Briefing where they had hoped to lobby ministers about more effective methods of dealing with itinerant Travellers.

CamBedRailRoad: Their "alternative" plans for the East-West rail route were unveiled in July and have received quite a bit of attention. The first draft shows a railway line skirting the southern end of Landbeach, North of the Milton Cemetery, and crossing the A10 near Penfold Farm to join the Kings Lynn railway line between Milton and Waterbeach. This section would be under ground.

Fen Road Chesterton, sewage arrangements: Anglian Water have now accepted HMS petition for a sewer on Fen Road and are again starting to assess the site. We are still waiting for a decision from Government (HIF bid for about £200m) on whether they will fund moving the sewage works – the final decision is now expected in February at the earliest but they are working on the business plan and it all looks positive so far.







### APPENDIX 2: COMMUNITY FORUM - Draft Terms of Reference

### Purpose and Objectives

The forum has be formed to provide support and advice on the preparation of the Cambridge Northern Fringe Area Action Plan (CNF AAP) and ensure that councils produce an appropriate ('fit for purpose') and successful document in accordance with the regulations.

### Advise

Provide advice on planning matters that need to be addressed through preparation of the CNF AAP, including identifying issues, challenges or opportunities for the planning officers to pick up.

Help to identify and create opportunities for meaningful collaborative working.

Provide advice on how best to approach and engage the local community and other stakeholders in public consultation on the draft CNF AAP.

### Influence

Champion the CNF AAP within the district.

### **Powers**

The Forum will have no formal powers of decision, but will act as an advisory body, and shall act in the capacity of key stakeholder in the pursuit of its objectives.

The Forum may request representation or presentation on matters that further the objectives of the Forum.

### Membership & Meetings

Membership of the Forum is open to representatives of the local community with an interest the future regeneration of the Cambridge Northern Fringe area.

Attendance at the meeting is by Membership only, with the exception of those presenting at the request of the forum with the aim of keeping the total numbers to a maximum of around 15 individuals at each meeting to aid the discussion.

The Forum shall meet on a four to six week cycle.

A Chairperson shall be nominated and elected by the Forum members.

The Chairperson shall be responsible for agreeing agendas and other related material. Planning officers will support the Chairperson in this function.

Officers of the councils will attend meetings as part of the Forum, and will provide information, briefings and take feedback.

Action points from each meeting will be taken and circulated for information/action to Forum members within 10 working days of each meeting.

Dear Sarah & Anna.

While crossing Cambridge Road this morning I was approached by a speeding vehicle making little attempt to slow down. So I feel compelled to write to the Parish Council again about the MVAS & the consideration of other traffic calming measures.

Please advise if any in the following is incorrect.

From the Parish Council meeting minutes I believe the MVAS has been available since Mar 18, during the approx 6 months the sign has been available it has not yet been positioned on Cambridge Road between Tesco & the shops to my knowledge. Based on my limited knowledge of traffic through the 3 villages sharing the MVAS, I suspect this location is one of the worst for volume & quantity of speeding vehicles.

Perhaps you do not consider speeding traffic through this part of Milton an issue (I believe it is), perhaps other issues are taking priority with the Parish Council or there have been delays with the MVAS I have not found in the minutes. I am sure that you care, despite the seemingly slow progress.

Again from the Parish Council minutes I believe a timetable for the use of the MVAS was agreed in Apr 18, however I have not found anything of substance in the minutes (nor received anything meaningful to my previous emails on this topic), so please advise when you will provide the following:

- 1, A clear schedule of all planned MVAS locations stating, dates & direction facing. The schedule should cover at least 1 (preferably 2) full set of all locations.
- 2, For each location please state exact position (lamppost number is fine), confirm that the site has been checked to give adequate MVAS performance & that you have approval to use that location.
- 3, The plan of action for the data collected by the MVAS (I believe from Anna's 5 Sep email to Simon Evans that data is being collected), including what thresholds & processes apply to the deployment of further speed reduction methods.

I request that these actions are specifically minuted in the next Parish Council meeting.

Point 2 above is to allay my 2nd Aug 18 email where I raised some potential concerns with the locations previously advised. I have not received any response to this email so I assume all is okay (although the Sep Parish Council minutes state 'query received from resident on current proposed locations. AB to meet with resident to discuss suitable locations — to be agreed at October meeting' - but as no contact has been made with me so far then I assume someone else has also raised concerns).

If you need any help with the use of the MVAS then I am happy to discuss this with you to see if I can help.







### County Councillor's Report for Parishes - October 2018

### **Heritage Assets**

I am very pleased that the County Planning Committee turned down the application from Amey for an **Energy from Waste** plant on Waterbeach Waste Management Park. The planning committee is only able to consider the <u>use of the land</u>, so the residents' heartfelt arguments about pollution, safety and competence of the operator could not be taken into account, as those matters are controlled by the Environment Agency permit.

In 2016 Milton were advised that a local developer was proposing a speculative application for 36 affordable houses outside the village framework, on land north of Fen Road. On the advice of the County Senior Archaeology Officer, I submitted an application to Historic England (HE), on behalf of the parish council, for the land to be designated as an ancient monument. A local archaeologist, had been involved in earlier exploratory digs, so we knew there was evidence of significant remains from Roman, Saxon and Medieval settlements in the field, which was almost certainly the historic centre of Milton. Initially HE made no determination, but as more evidence became available, they decided to re-consider the site. In spring 2018 HE recommended designation of the site and in June 2018 the Secretary of State designated the fields of Hill Close and Long Meadow, as an ancient monument. Long Meadow runs across the end of the football pitches at North Lodge Park. This means these fields are protected from development.

### **Highways**

Our Local Highways Officers (LHOs) are in an exhausting situation. In 'South' area, three Officers are covering the work of a fourth (vacancy) and at the next level up, there is just one District Manager in post where there should be four. Each LHO is having to cover their manager's work as well as their own work. Added to that, they have virtually no money left, six months into the financial year. LHOs are having to prioritise repairs on a 'danger of death' principle. I am disappointed that the siding-back the cycleway on the A10 has not been done and the pavements on High Street, Landbeach have not been deemed treacherous enough to repair.

In these straightened times I have been very pleased to see the B1047 repaired over the A14 bridge and more recently, substantial surface repairs on the A10 between Milton and Chittering.

Waterbeach Greenway – the proposal to run a cyclepathto Cambridge North Station, under the A14 between Milton Country Park and the railway line is being supported by Highways England and the developers of Waterbeach New Town. Plans are being drawn up by the Major Projects Delivery Team and they hope to start the public consultation on them in October, closing before Christmas. This group has also successfully bid for funding for "quick wins" – which will be used on two projects in Milton – to resurface Fen Road from the last house down to the river and from Tesco to the Country Park. Both of these routes are on Cycle National Network route 11.

The Halingway – River Cam towpath - I have arranged meetings between the Conservators of the Cam (CoC), City, SCDC and County to arrange for cutting of the grass and litter collection along the

towpath. The County is responsible, but for years, CoC have done the work, without being recompensed for it. The CoC can no longer afford to do this.

### Mobile Vehicle Activated Sign

The MVAS is now back in Landbeach for a couple of weeks. The sign appears to slow traffic down, which is very welcome. John Halfpenny will be making a short presentation of the data gathered so far, for the parishes in October. We have a team who move the sign but it is heavy and must be installed high, so offers of help from tall strong volunteers would be most welcome. Please contact the Clerks or Anna.

### **Buses**

I am very unhappy with the bus services through Milton, Landbeach, Waterbeach, Horningsea and Fen Ditton. I arranged a meeting with Stagecoach in August and Cllr Daunton and I protested about the reduction in service on 29 July. Stagecoach responded with a combined service timetable, which was helpful for passengers, but I was appalled when the service was revised again on 2 September and made even worse. I contacted Andy Campbell again and asked for resumption of the short-circuit 9 buses through Landbeach and an extra return through Horningsea after the 1215. I was told, "The service is tendered, so any addition journey would have to be requested by the Combined Authority." On requests for a more helpful helpline I was told, "Most visitors use technology to find information & tickets can be purchased by mobile phone or on bus using contactless."

In these circumstances you may find the Beaches Community Car Service helpful. <a href="http://www.horningsea.net/wp-content/uploads/2011/08/Beaches-Community-Car-Service.pdf">http://www.horningsea.net/wp-content/uploads/2011/08/Beaches-Community-Car-Service.pdf</a> Those needing to attend hospital or medical appointments are prioritised. They would very much welcome new volunteer drivers.

### **Library Charges**

Earlier this year the County Council decided to charge people for using the computers in libraries to access the internet. It was a part of its plan to make more money out of its library operations. It has failed on two counts. Firstly it hasn't raised any money. It was forecast to raise £108k but recent reports forecast an income of just £4k. Secondly it has also reduced computer usage by 54%, so users have cut their usage time. Usage for less than half hour (charging only starts after 30 minutes) is up 20% - so maybe more people are getting onto the internet but realising how little you can get done in 30 minutes.

### District Councillors' Report - October 2018 - Cllr Anna Bradnam

Changes to some bin collections proposed – the changes should reduce the number of bin lorries on the road during the rush hour traffic on the A10 and generate savings. Residents in Cambridge City and South Cambs will receive the same high level of service wherever they live. If approved by both Councils, the changes would be:

- Monthly green bin collections in the City for three months in winter, matching South Cambs.
- Cambridge City crews to start their rounds from around 6:30am, as is already the case in South Cambs. This was trialled during the hot weather and the service received no complaints, so it makes sense to extend it to the City.
- A small fee payable for <u>South Cambridgeshire residents</u> if you want an extra green bin collected, as is the case in nearly all other Council areas including Cambridge City.

Since the Greater Cambridge Shared Waste Service began waste collections in February 2017, they have been tidying up policies and back-office functions to ensure it is as efficient as possible. The service recycles around 50% of all waste collected across Cambridge and South Cambs and, according to latest figures, collects 99.7% of all bins on-time.

### Licensing

The District is incorporating into policy, revisions from national guidance. This has gone out for consultation with the taxi companies. One aspect is the introduction of CCTV inside the cab and we have received some objections.

### Waterbeach Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) - consultation

There will be an exhibition and workshop on Monday 8 October from 12:30 in the Salvation Army Hall.

### CamBedRailRoad

This consortium presented their concept for a link in the West to East (heavy) rail network at Landbeach Village Hall on  $10^{th}$ . The residents of Landbeach are concerned that landholdings will be split by the rail line, which also seems to run straight through some houses and businesses in Milton parish. The concept allowed for the line to be sunk in engineered channels to go under roads. The connection to the N-S line from Ely to Cambridge is not easy to envisage. The consortium want an opportunity for their concept to be considered alongside other proposals for the line.

### <u> District Councillors Report - October 2018 - Hazel Smith</u>

### **Police Panel**

There were a number of "interesting" points from the Police Panel meeting with the Police and Crime Commissioner on 11<sup>th</sup> September:

If you did not know - and I didn't - the threat to close the Cambridge Magistrates Court has gone way for the moment (though the site on St Andrew's Street is very marketable so this is likely to return in a future proposal) - thanks to evidence including from the PCC and their extensive consultations.

Police Neighbourhood Panels have gone for good. The PCC's proposed alternative is a meeting for parish councillors probably once a year with him and his team, called a Parish Council Conference. The panel had been told that the South Cambs Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership meetings at Cambourne (the next one is 17<sup>th</sup> Oct, 1:15) are seen by the police as the route to report things to them in person if we then want to discuss them. Otherwise, we should use the Cambs Police website to report it online (one way flow of information). And individual officers may attend Parish Council meetings occasionally if we invite them, and they have the time.

Dash-cam, helmet-cam and video evidence is a popular way to record problems but the public need to be aware that the police have to download it themselves from the original device for it to be used in evidence, so don't send them a snippet and delete the original. Also they currently rarely have time to do this, unfortunately, but they recognise will be important in future.

Police work has traditionally been 60% non-criminal work and 40% criminal. In the last few years the 60% has increased to 80%. A lot of the non-criminal work now is due to members of the public with mental health issues. The PCC sees no sign that the option of dialling 111 option 2 for the mental health team has helped with this.

We sometimes feel a lot of information is given to the police and nothing is fed back. Often this is because they are building up a picture and hoping to arrest the whole gang. There were 38 arrests for drugs offences in Cambridge in early September – the culmination of a large piece of work.

### South Cambs Local Plan

The local plan inspectors declared the plan "sound" and have not made many changes. It landed at South Cambs in early September, and the required changes have been made, and the plan printed up for adoption by Council on 27<sup>th</sup> September. We can now formally make progress moving on with the Northern Fringe AAP and the Waterbeach SPD.

### Cambridge Northern Fringe planning

At an initial meeting with senior councillors, we were reminded that the AAP has gone through one round of consultation including 4 options on different sizes of Waste Water Treatment (WWT) plant. The new AAP will be developed in parallel with the Housing Infrastructure Fund bid for at least £193 million, which is now being worked up in consultation with government officers. The two processes dovetail together, and there seems to be an assumption that the HIF bid will be successful, provided the viability work does not turn up anything unforeseen. The new location for the WWT works will lie in a huge area of search from Cottenham across to Honey Hill. The next process would be a Development Consent Order for the move.

The first meeting of the Local Liaison Forum for CNF is on 4<sup>th</sup> October.

### Waterbeach planning

The SPD is now out for consultation. The local plan asks for 2,300 houses by 2031.

### **Universal Credit**

We had a meeting with the DWP officers charged with introducing UC in South Cambs from mid-October. They had experience from doing the same last year in Peterborough and they have learnt some lessons from this: they will not expect people to wait for so long before getting their first payment, and there is also the possibility of payment up-front, as a loan to be repaid by deductions from future payments over the following year. Anyone thinking they may have financial difficulties because of going onto UC should contact Cambridge CAB or South Cambs DC sooner rather than later – they have experienced officers who can help. There will also be DWP advisors at the Job Centre.

### Tenant issues

The annual Best Kept Garden competition prizegiving was a very pleasant evening at the Cancer Centre next to Scotsdales. Entries came from right across the district, including one from Denson Close, Waterbeach. There is a wide variety of categories to enter, and 20 prizes to be won. We have some very talented and dedicated gardeners in the district.

### Climate change action

The Lib Dems have immediately stopped providing single-use plastic cups etc at Cambourne – a start. The new committee has looked at how we can influence further afield, discussing air pollution, single-use plastics and investments in green energy.

### A14(M)

The new A14 from the M11 northwards to the A1(M) will be put forward to have motorway status. The time-lapse video of the Bar Hill bridge installation is here: https://www.voutube.com/watch?v=nvBryO0O6xA

### District councillor's report - October 2018 - Judith Rippeth

**Universal Credit** is being rolled out across South Cambs from 17<sup>th</sup> October. New claimants and those whose circumstances have changed will be put onto this new system of benefits. Universal Credit is a benefit for people of working age so pensioners will be unaffected. South Cambs have produced a helpful leaflet which explains how to get payments set up. I am in the process of distributing the leaflet to Waterbeach Library and pharmacy, doctor's surgeries and community hubs throughout the ward. The information is also available on the South Cambs website.

As a trustee of Emmaus I attended the September board meeting where we were updated on the building project and on a number of issues. Companions have moved into the new accommodation and new residents are gradually joining the community. By December, Emmaus will be helping 44 people get their lives back on track. As the companions live in temporary or supported accommodation the charity will still be able to claim housing benefit. The downside of being able to offer a home to more people and of higher footfall in the café is that the sewage system is collapsing and engineers are needing to be called out frequently. The community needs to raise £150 000 for a new Klargester urgently. I will ask the Grants Committee to see if South Cambs can help in any way towards this much needed investment.

I met with the Cycling Projects Officer at County last week to establish the progress being made on the **Waterbeach Greenway**. The plan is to construct a new cycle path (with bridleway in sections) connecting Cambridge and Waterbeach Railway stations following a route which goes via Milton and runs just West of the railway line for much of the distance. This depends on a second tranche of funding expected from the Greater Cambridge Partnership in Spring 2019. All being well this route is due for completion in 2020. A consultation will be held in Waterbeach on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> November between 5:00 and 7:00pm.

As you know the **Waterbeach SPD** is out for public consultation ( $14^{th}$  September –  $28^{th}$  October.) An event is being held at the Salvation Army Hall between 12:30 and 7:30pm specifically about the Waterbeach Railway Station.

### Dear Parish Council

I'm a parent helper for Milton Ladies football U14's, and having recently completed the FA first aid training, I have become aware of exercise-induced Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) and the importance of an Automatic External Defibrillator (or AED) in saving young people's lives in the event of an SCA. The FA's mandatory training courses mean that all the Milton football coaches and helpers are or will soon be trained in the correct and appropriate use of AED's (though AED's are usable even by untrained members of the public).

Football is a form of exercise which is well known to trigger SCA in susceptible young people. I understand that the nearest AED is some distance away at Coles Road. Given the advice that every minute lost before using an AED leads to a 10% reduction in survival of an SCA, and a likely round trip to fetch it would probably take 5-10 minutes, it seems to me vital that the Parish Council installs an AED at North Lodge Park (NLP).

Does the Parish council have plans to install an AED at NLP in the very near future? If not, then assuming that the reason for not doing so is financial, then would they consider asking for donations to support the purchase and installation? I would be willing to donate, if you were to do so.

Thanks for passing this on but I'm not sure it would be possible to put a crossing close to the roundabout, as traffic on the roundabout would have to stop to allow people to cross.

If it were further up the slip road, I doubt if anyone would walk away from the roundabout to use it. We do have an island, so pedestrians can cross each carriageway separately and cars are usually driving fairly slowly going around the roundabout, which makes it slightly easier to cross.

If members of the parish council would like a crossing, I think they would have to follow the Local Highway Improvement process and find out if the parish would support a crossing and paying towards it. The webpage with information about how to make an application is here
