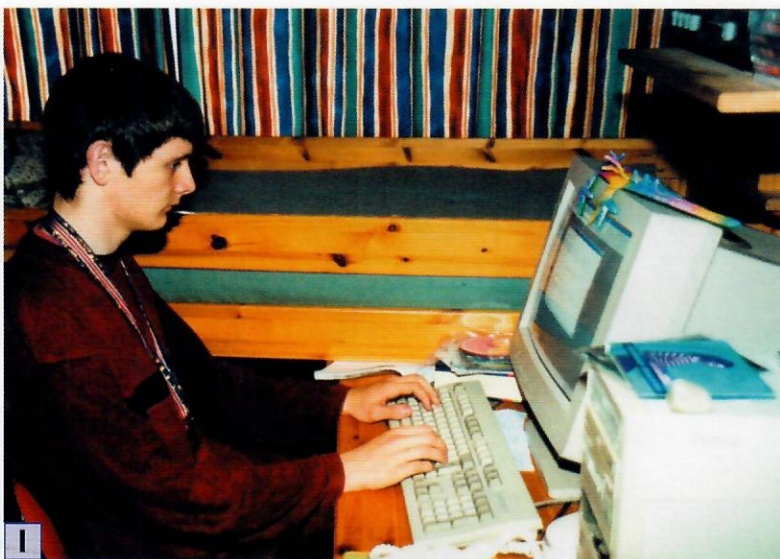

Funeral bier

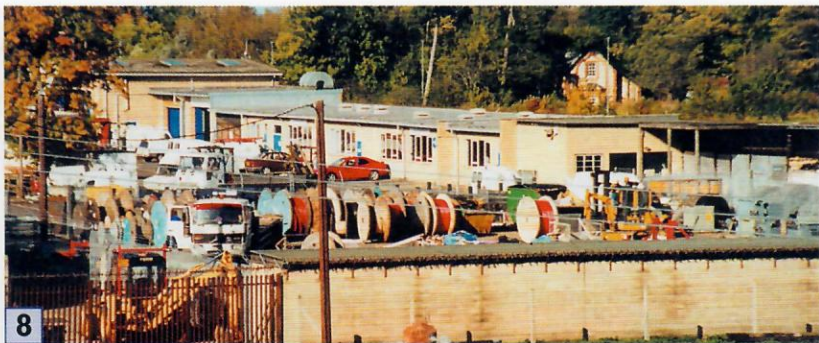

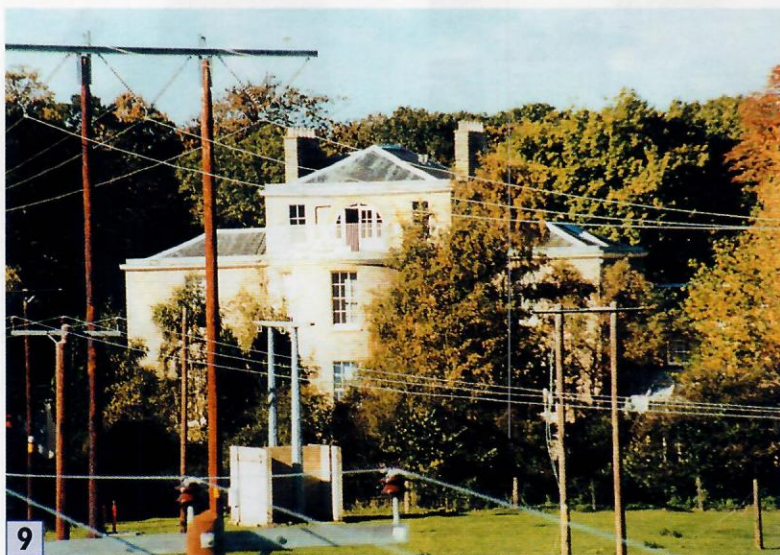

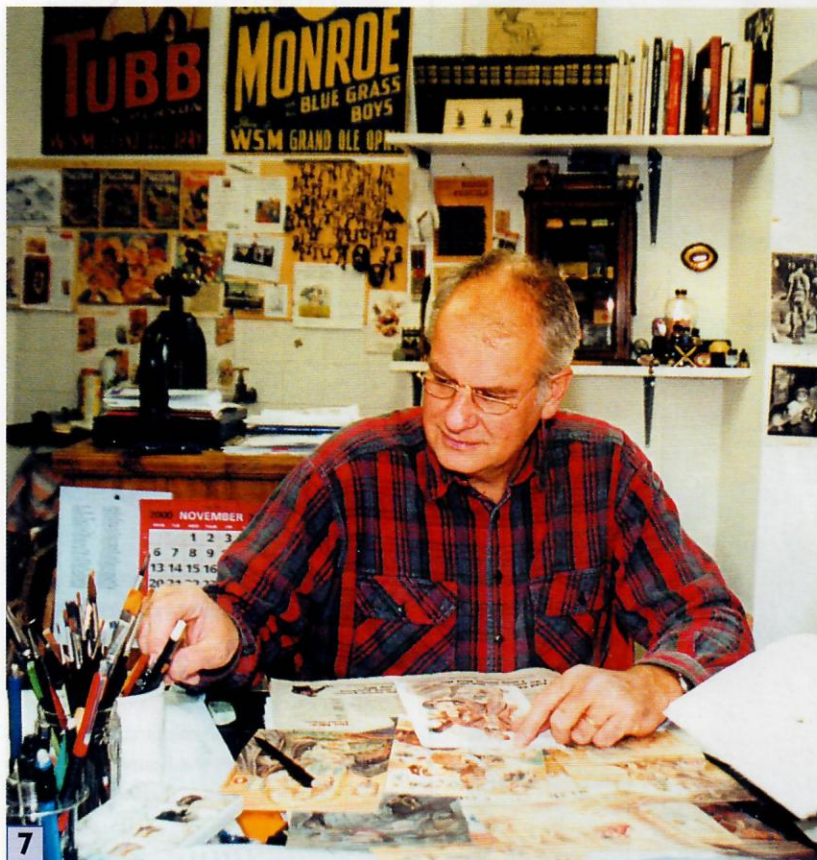
